Five of the new coaches for the DSS&A will leave the shops at Wilmington, Del., on the 9th. They will be very elegant in design and finish, the next thing in fact to Wagner cars.

The railroad eating rooms at this station have been greatly enlarged and improved and thoroughly refitted, furnishing the finest eating house accommodations on the line. They will unload from both sides of the dock, and will keep four engines busy shifting cars, unloading from three hatches at the same time, taking out 1,000 tons in less than ten hours.
