International Dinner






Mud Festival — 1970


There are well over a thousand different types of professional activities which stem from a preparation in the Visual Arts and over eighty percent of them do not require a free hand drawing skill.

At the graduate level Master of Arts in Education degrees are available in elementary education, secondary education, counseling and guidance, and school administration.











The curriculum underwent many alterations in '66 in order to meet the needs for physics today. The most modern equipment is available to course participants.




Earth Science, Conservation and Geography
