LOOKING AT THE NORTHERN SHUFFLE

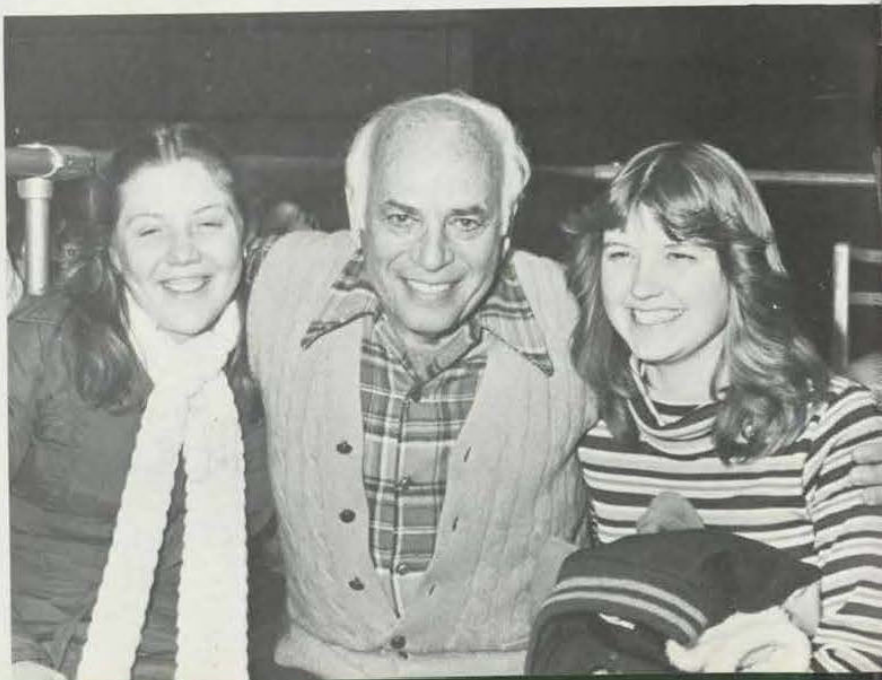
PRESIDENT FORD LOOKS AT N.M.U.

The 1978 NMU football Wildcats will go down in history as one of the finest passing teams ever to play here.

Despite a 5-4-1, coach Bill Rademacher's squad broke 12 school records, all of which were related to the pass.

Quarterback Todd Krueger's strong left arm helped rewrite four individual records, despite the junior's absence in nearly three full games.

Tight end Greg Grigsby, who wasn't even in the starting line-up when the season began, was voted the most valuable player by his teammates. The senior from Cincinnati, Ohio, was the club's leading receiver, catching 30 passes for 432 yards and three touchdowns.

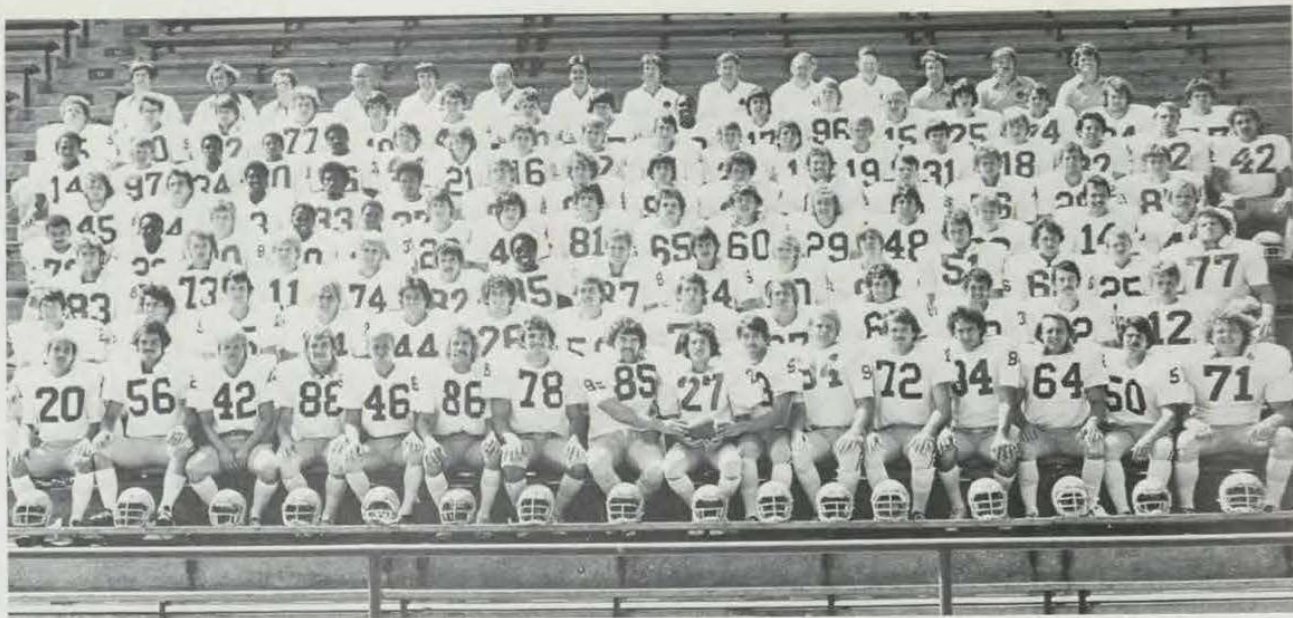
Fans will also remember 1978 as the year of the injury. Every starter in the so-called skilled positions on offense missed at least one game with an injury.

Rademacher's first season as a Wildcat head coach began with a pair of explosive wins at Memorial Field. First came a 30-3 walloping of NCAA Division I Eastern Michigan. A week later Grand Valley was the victim, this time by a 49-22 count.

Halfway through the campaign, the 'Cats were still in good shape with a 4-1-1 record. But three straight losses to Mid-Continent opponents Eastern Illinois, Akron and Northern Iowa knocked Northern out of any hope for playoff competition.

The skid began when the Wildcats let a big third quarter lead slip away from them against Eastern Illinois. Eastern — who would later be crowned the NCAA Division II's national champion — escaped from Memorial Field with a 42-34 win.

From then on, the Wildcats, plagued by a heavy rash of injuries, could never regain the form that paved the way for their march into the Wildcat passing record book.



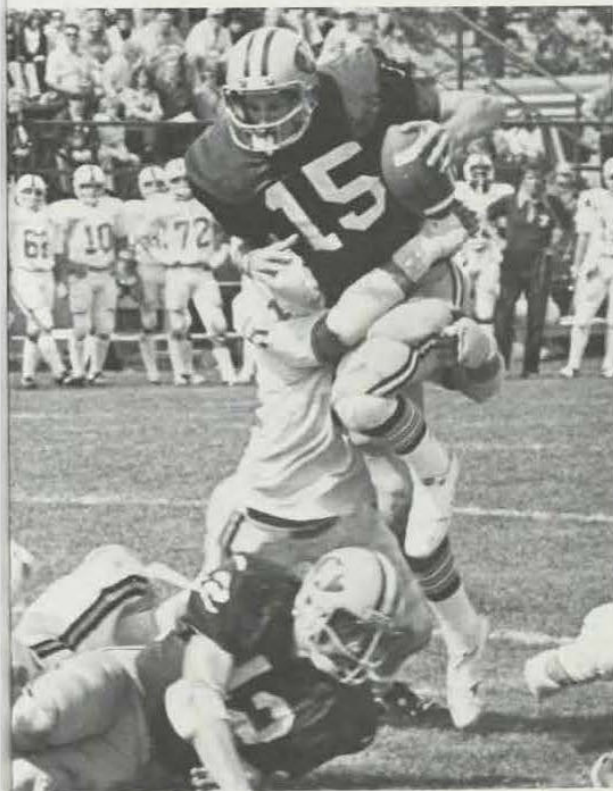

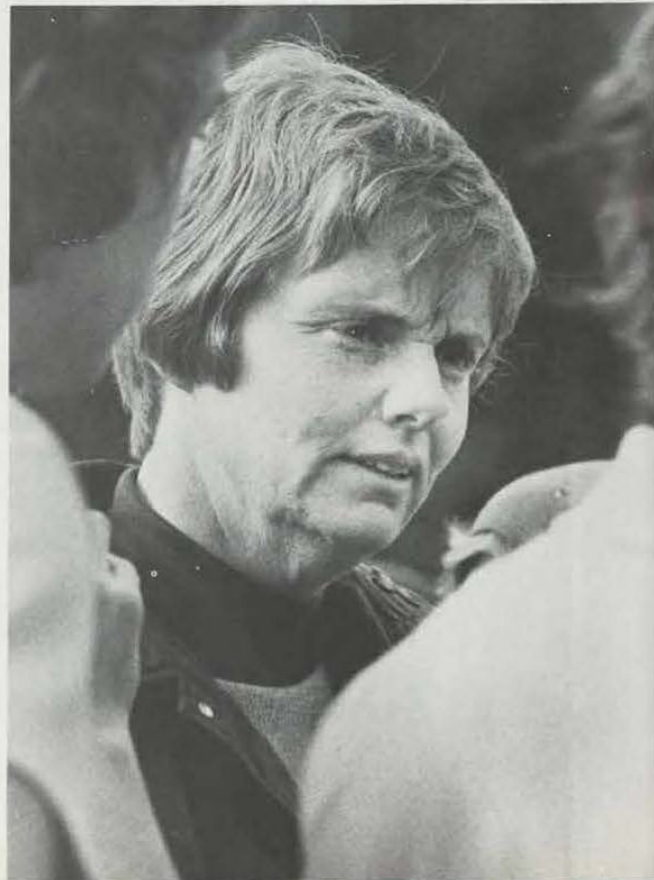
Close but no cigar. That's about the best way to sum up the season for this year's field hockey team.

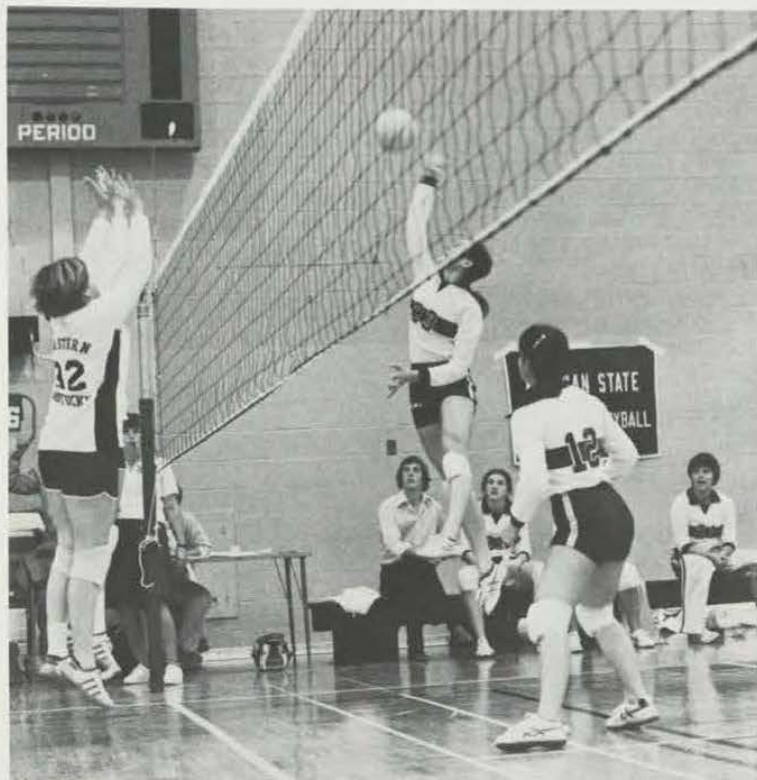

The aggressive efforts of Hunt's squad enabled them to set Northern records of most games played in a season at 36, and most games won, 16.

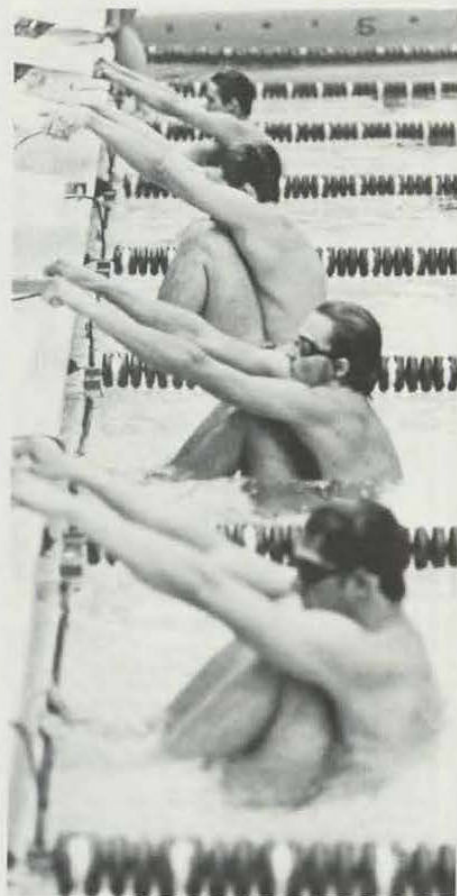
The spikers finished fourth in the Wayne State Renaissance Tournament and competed in the AIAW State Tournament before losing in the quarterfinals.

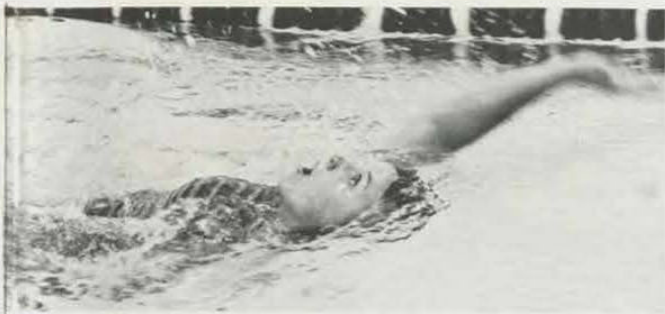
Northern Michigan and coach Don Trost have established an enviable swimming tradition. And 1979 was no exception.

New and old faces shined for Trost. On one hand was senior Tim Kerwin, a national runner-up the year before, who was a Wildcat leader in the breaststroke events.

On the other hand was freshman David Achtemeier, who broke on the local swimming scene by setting team highs in the majority of the freestyle events.

All in all, nine of the 16 members of the men's swim roster were freshmen. And they were treated to a rare occurrence in their first season at NMU — a chance to see the national swimming and diving championships in their own pool. NMU hosted NCAA Division II meets in mid-March.

Three of the top freshmen included Karen Held in the freestyle, Robbie Mehoke in the breaststroke, and Sue Berger in the backstroke.

The hockey Wildcats, for the second straight season, have finished in third place in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association. The 'Cats, members of the CCHA for only the second year, qualified for the league playoffs with the third place finish. They traveled to Columbus, Ohio, to meet the Ohio State Buckeyes in the first round of the playoffs.

Since its short existence, "Year Three" of hockey at NMU was the toughest. Key injuries and not being able to win in overtime were the biggest obstacles.

Defenseman Don Waddell, last year's Co-Player-of-the-Year in the CCHA, suffered two injuries and did not return to top form until late in the season. Goaltender Barrie Oakes, the team's MVP in 1977, left the team midway through the season because of knee problems.

Seven overtime games were played during the regular season and the Wildcats managed to win only one of them. Two more games resulted in ties. Of the seven games, six times the 'Cats were ahead only to be tied by the end of regulation time.

Even with the obstacles, the team won five straight games at the end of the regular season to head into the playoffs with a full head of steam. The league record was 13-10-1 and before going into the playoffs had an overall record of 19-11-2.

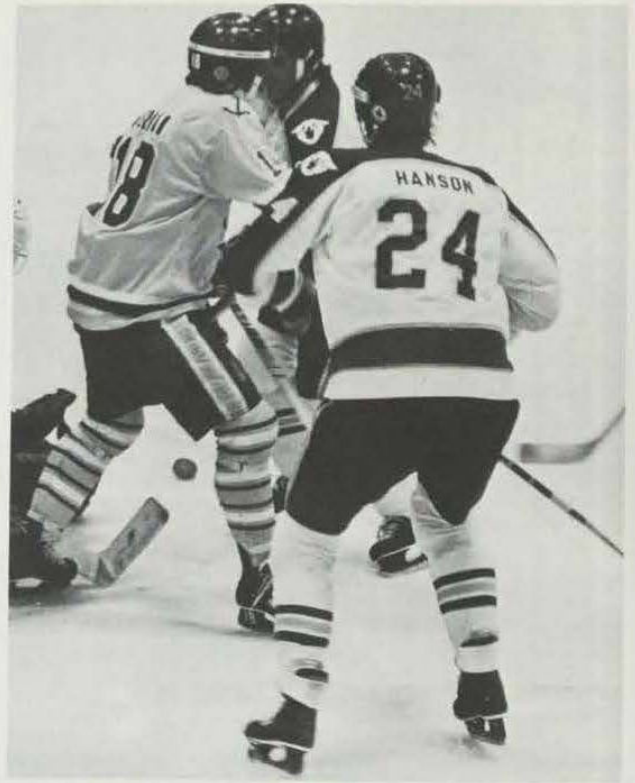

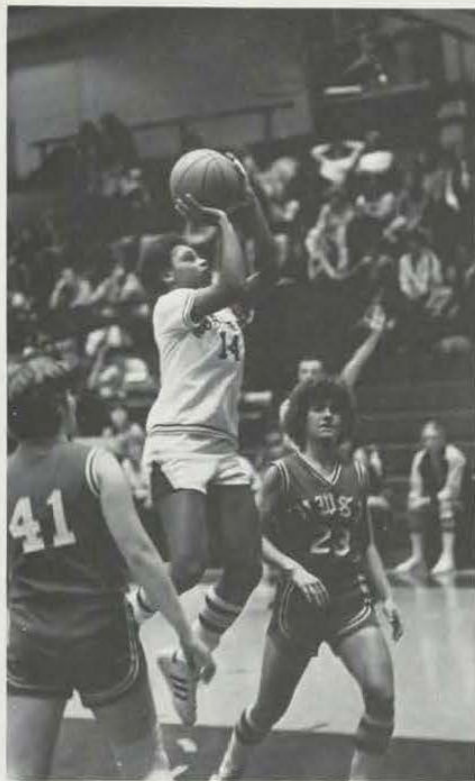
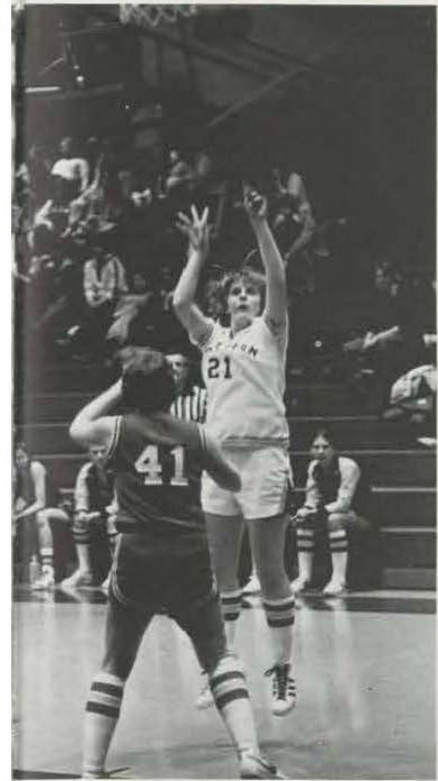

At times the 'Cats played with five freshmen on the floor.

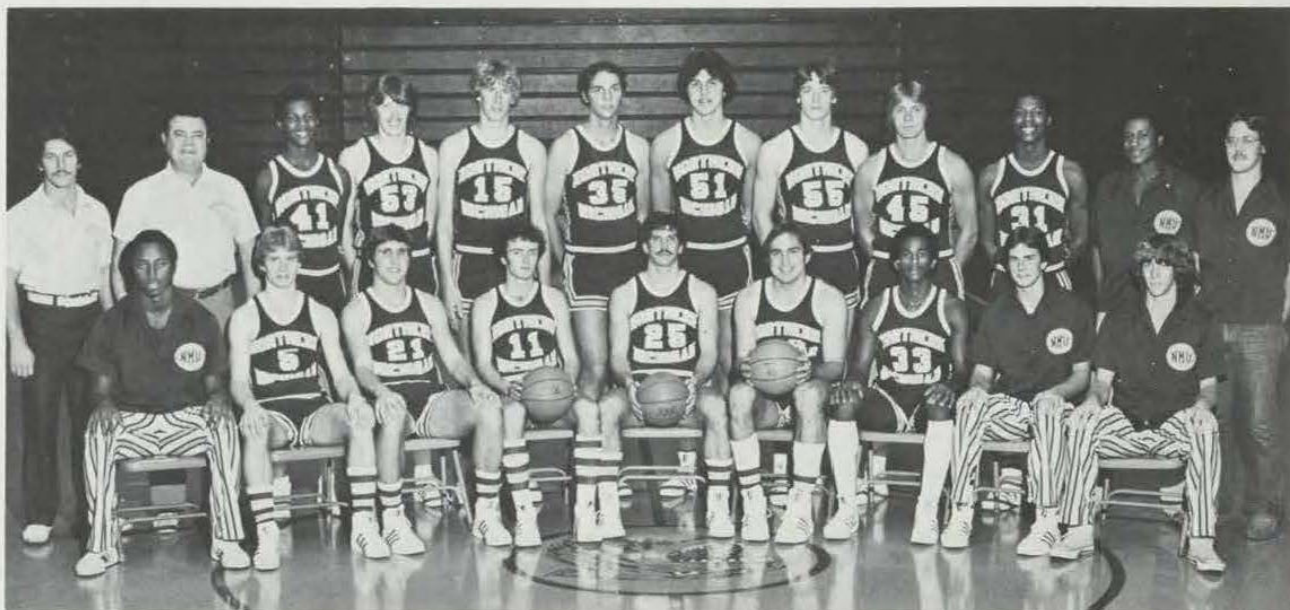
Despite the inexperience and a schedule laced with tough-to-win downstate trips, the women cagers won half their games.

In one mid-season stretch, NMU came out ahead in 16 of 18 games, including a pair of revenge wins over UWGB.

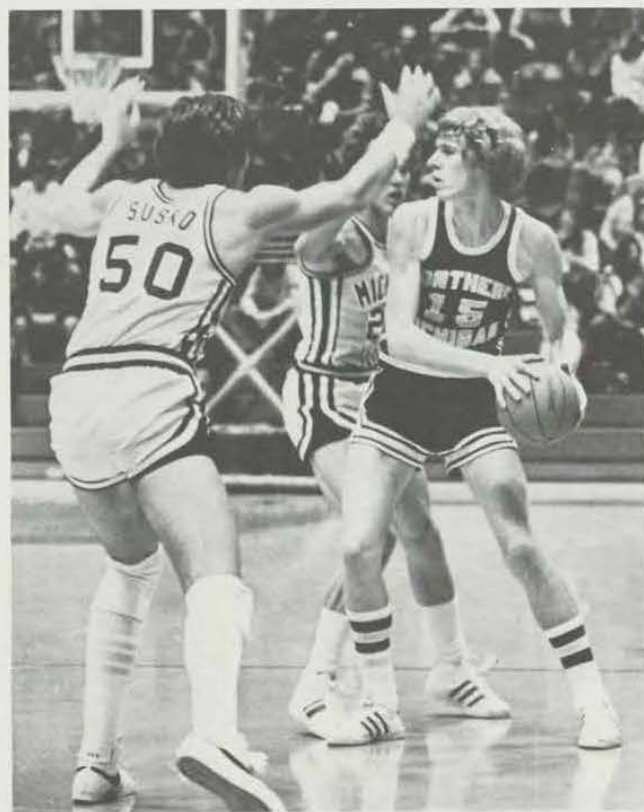
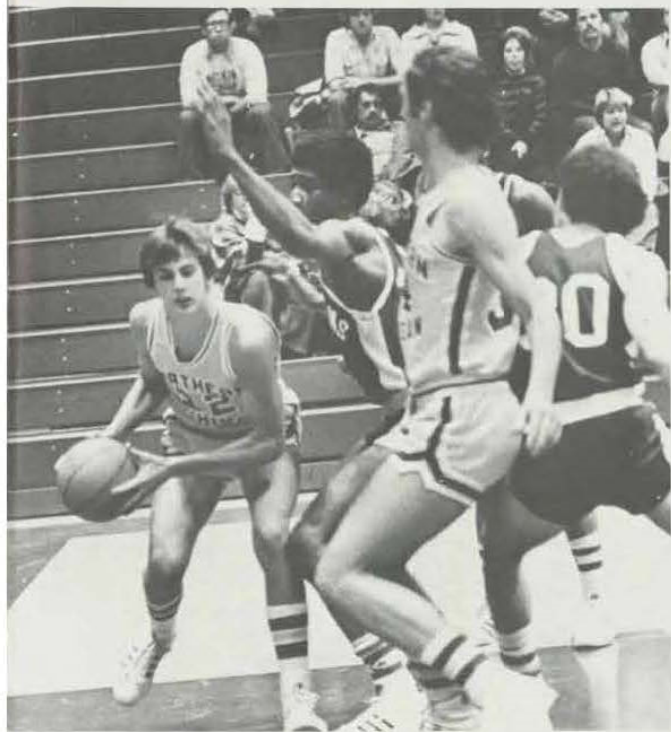
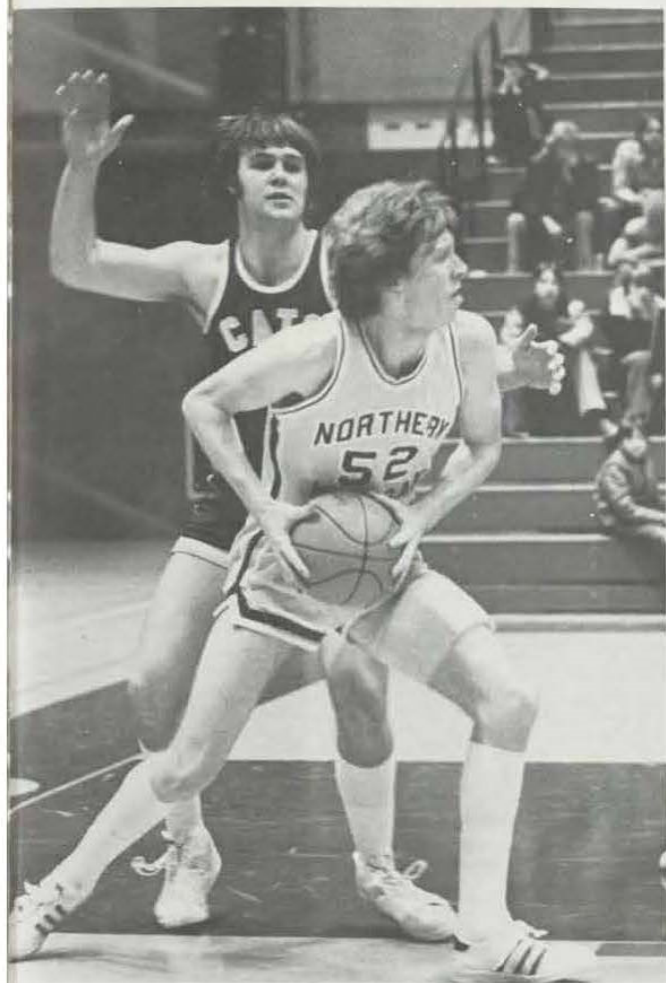

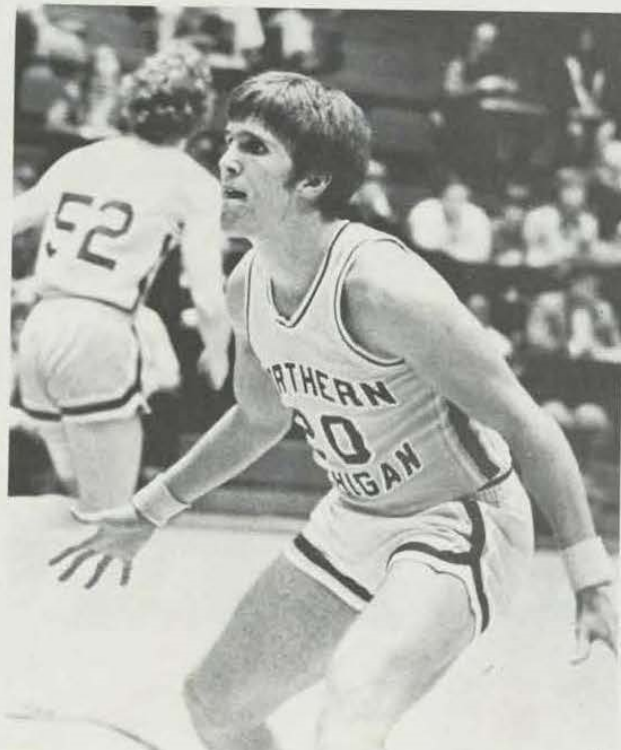
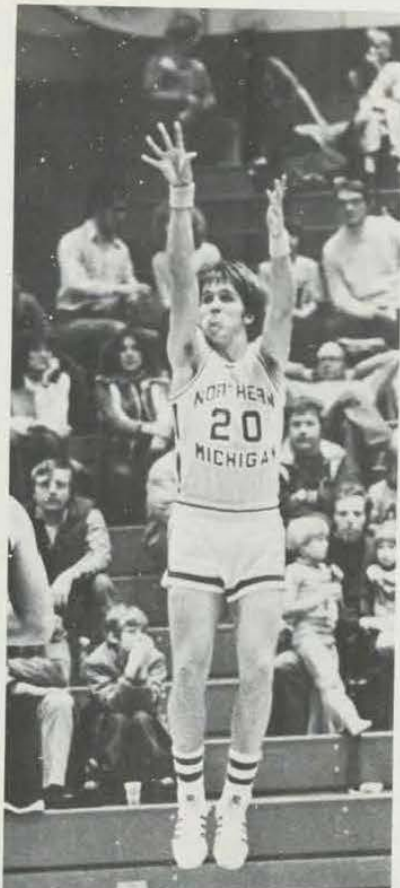
Mindeman and Randy Jenkins, a slick shooting guard from Muskegon, were the top scorers all season on a team where balance was the name of the game.

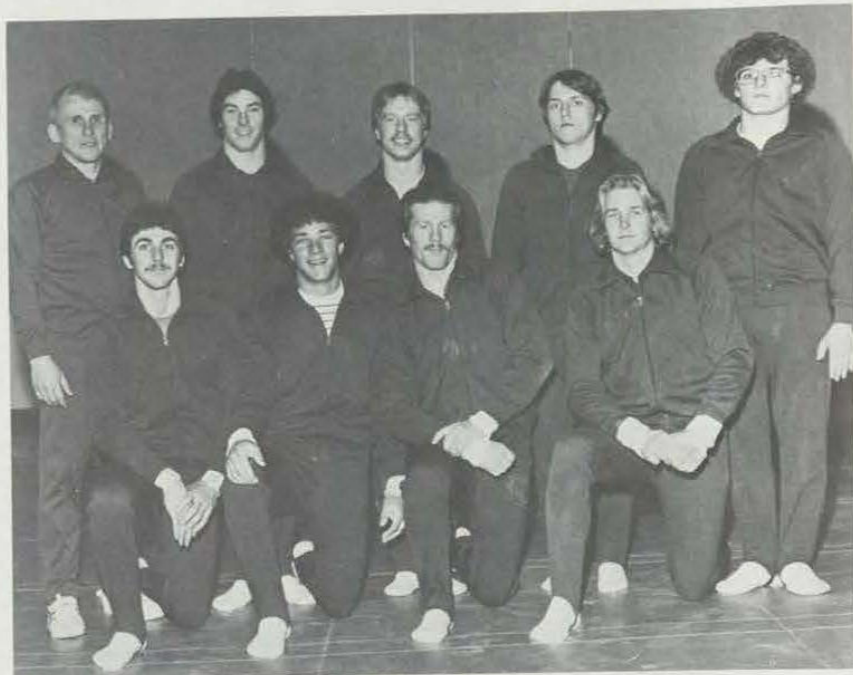
It may be a long time before Northern ever has a gymnastics team to compare with this year's.

Northern's wrestling squad had one of its finest seasons posting a 10-1 dual meet record. In tournaments the team captured three firsts and finished second twice.

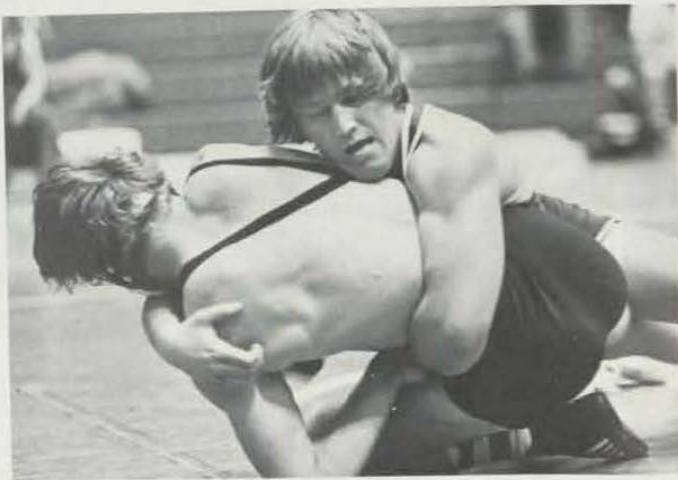
Going into the Mid-Continent Conference championships, the top wrestlers in each weight category had a combined record of 281 wins, 67 losses, and one tie.

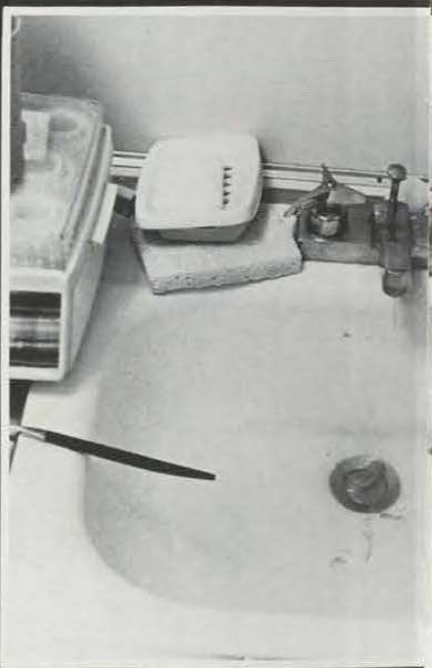
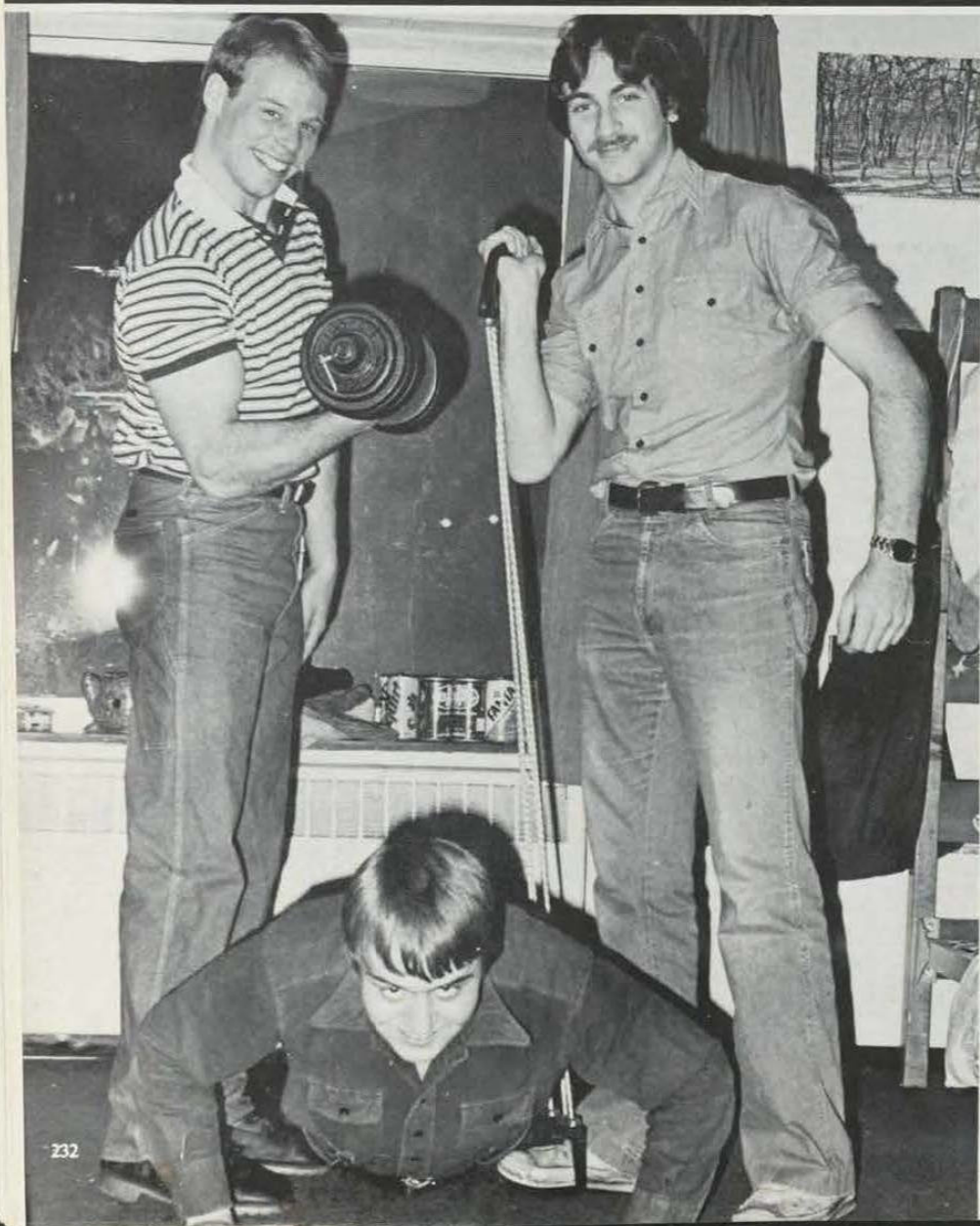
State Universities such as Northern Michigan are the perpetrators of American values. They are the springboard from which generations of students have taken their places as respected citizens and important contributors to American Society.

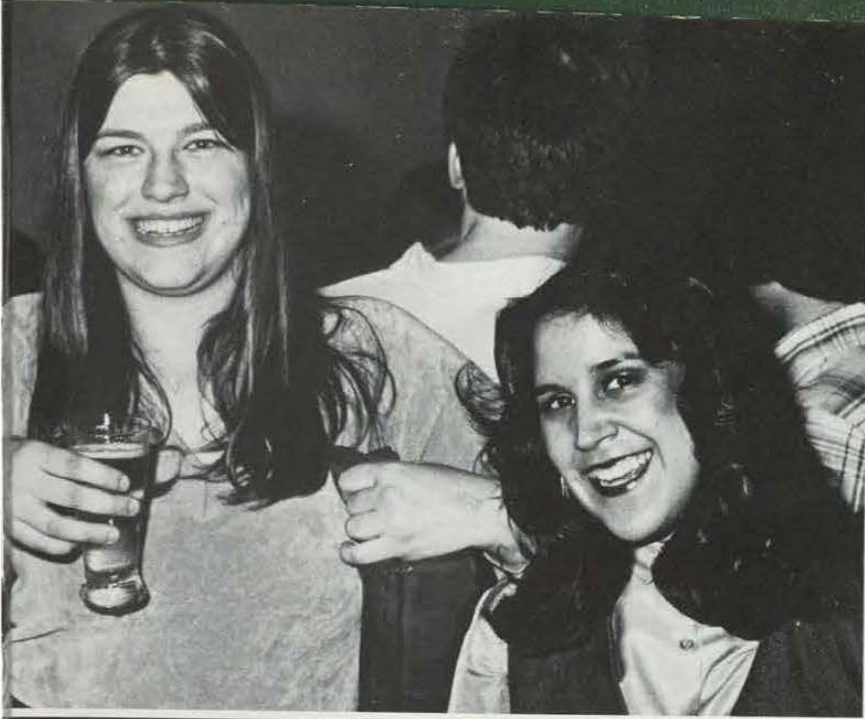

Congratulations to all as you begin your futures!





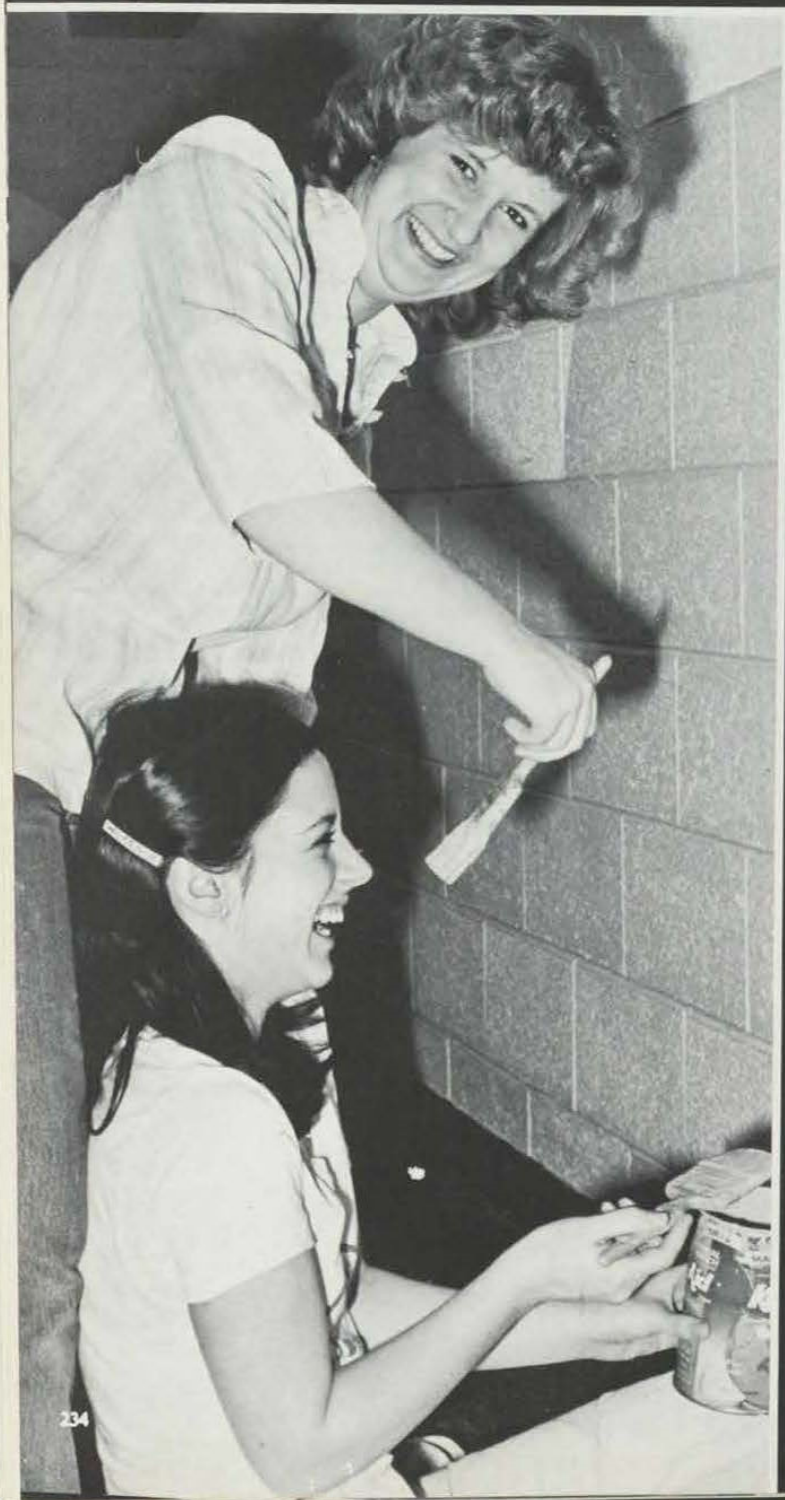
