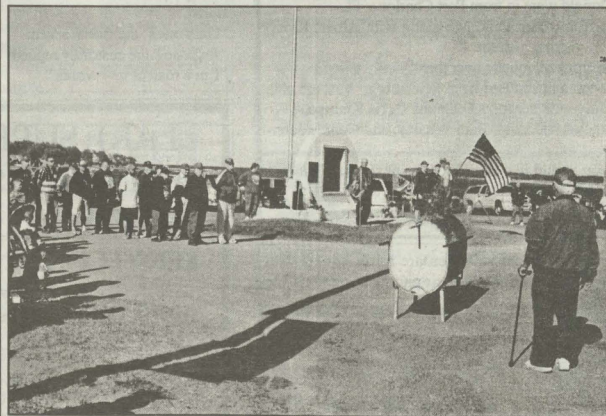

## Supervisor and Treasurer Resigns

Lee Durrwachter, Burt Township Supervisor resigns at the start of the Regular Burt Township Board meeting on July 11, 2006. Lee's resignation is effective immediately.

Jim Seibert, Burt Township Treasurer resigns effective Aug. 31, 2001. Jim stated that he would help the new treasurer with the turn over and the winter tax bills in November.

**Regular Meeting of the Burt Township Board**

June 24, 2006 – 12:00 p.m.

**Attendance:** Lee Durrwachter, Kay Wampler, James Seibert, Gordon Kniss, Lois Leavenworth – Citizens: approx 80

**Approval of the Agenda:** Motion by James Seibert, second by Lois Leavenworth to approve the agenda as amended. 5 ayes

**Public Comment:** Supervisor Durrwachter made a public apology for his comment at the last meeting regarding the hiring of a local graduate. Aaron Hunt requested to investigation further, contact the prosecuting attorney to conduct a professional formal investigation and state that failure will result in Citizens Group to seek restitution to recover penalties and interest. Donna Oglevie asked if we could do questions at the end – okay with the board. The Treasurer made one request to allow the committee to present in full without interruption. Closed at 12:12 p.m.

**Correspondence:** Supervisor noted that he had correspondence indicating that Seney Township was once again donating \$1000 toward the Fireworks and asked if they could bring their Groomers for the parade. Request from Nikki Darrow use of the Bandstand to sell baked goods, email from Lori Savage regarding the Web Site and turning it over to the Board, Alger Regional Community Foundation grant toward cots for CERT approved, Update from IRS (Lori Hill) on recent payment, Letter from Lois Kinlaw asking for Supervisor Durrwachter's resignation and his response back to her, Letter from Grant Peterson on behalf of the Hiawatha Water Trail, Airport Master Record/Inspection – couple of findings to address – **Additional Correspondence read upon reconvening on June 27<sup>th</sup>:** Dan & Gwen Bradish request to use Bayshore Bandstand during Kayak Weekend, Letter from State Police declining request to lower speed limit on H-58 East.

**Reports:** Lea Ward-Harbaum – Youth Center Coordinator, Mike Beek – DPW and Water Dept Mgr, & Sheri Shafer – Park Manager all presented their reports to the board – on file in the Clerks office. The Clerk asked to finish the review/approval of Kevin Brekke's application. **The Ad hoc Committee** made a formal presentation of their Final Report to the community and the board. Open discussion was permitted after the report - There was a great deal of time spent with the public to address their questions and provide feedback to the board on the findings. Many were concerned over how we planned to repay the loans. A short break was taken at approximately 3:00 p.m..

**James Seibert moved to accept the Ad Hoc Committee report and thank them for their time and efforts –** seconded by Gordon Kniss - Roll Call Vote: Lois Leavenworth – aye, James Seibert – aye, Lee Durrwachter – aye, Gordon Kniss – aye, Kay Wampler – abstained. **Motion** by James Seibert, second by Lois Leavenworth to approve the motion offered by the Supervisor to “consult with the Michigan Townships Association (MTA) to review the report and to see what additional recommendations/suggestions they would make: and to see if there are additional ways to implement the report's recommendations.” - Roll Call Vote: Lois Leavenworth – aye, Jim Seibert – aye, Lee Durrwachter – aye, Gordon Kniss – aye, Kay Wampler – aye - **Motion** to table some items, go directly to Item 9A – Assessor issue and to Reconvene on Monday, June 26 by James Seibert and Kay Wampler – amended to reconvene on the 29<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. – 5 ayes

**9. Unfinished Business:**

**a) Review of Assessor Applications, per STC's letter dated May 24, 2006 – Motion** by James Seibert, second by Lois Leavenworth to hire Susan Tillison to reassess @ \$24,315 per year. Amended to approve hiring pending resolution of contract terms and put on the agenda for Thursday – Roll Call: Lee Durrwachter – aye, Lois Leavenworth – aye, Gordon Kniss – aye, James Seibert – aye, Kay Wampler – aye.

**Payment of Bills –** Clerk Wampler presented a proposed new format for the bill sheet generated out of QuickBooks that is basically a check register from each fund excluding the deposit column. Members liked the new format and found it easier to read but suggested to add the deposits. James Seibert & Kay Wampler agreed to combine the new format with the treasurers' report to include the deposits. **Motion** by James Seibert, second by Lois Leavenworth to pay the bills as presented. – 5 ayes

**Rescued at 3:21 on Motion by James Seibert, Second by Gordon Kniss Reconvened on June 27<sup>th</sup>, 2006 @ 7:00 p.m. Clerk requested to revisit the correspondence and include new items since Saturday - Motion** by Kay Wampler, second by James Seibert to approve baked goods sales by Nikki Darrow at the Bandstand pending health department permit / requirements. – 5 ayes. **Motion** by Lois Leavenworth, second by James Seibert to approve Bradishes request with health department approval – 5 ayes. **Motion** by James Seibert, second by Lois Leavenworth to approve the “Schwan Man's” request to sell ice cream from his truck on the 4<sup>th</sup> as requested – 5 ayes

**8) New Business:**

**A) Request by Rosie Meldrum's letter dated: May 11, 2006: Motion** by James Seibert, second by Gordon Kniss to agree to grant an easement as requested “as long as we do it right” with no cost to the township – 5 ayes **B) Resolution request by Supervisor for Loan Authorizations, retroactively – Withdrawn by the Supervisor at this time. C) Planning Commission 5/16/06 Minutes:** Motion by Seibert, second by Lois Leavenworth to accept the addition to the Zoning Ordinance. No Vote – revised to Table and to give our notes to the committee for consideration and possible correction. **D) Credit Card Resolution: Motion** by James Seibert, second by Kay Wampler to approve the Credit Card Use Policy Resolution as read by the Clerk. – 5 ayes **E) Request to assume maintenance on Lost Souls Memorial at Marina –** Clerk read letter to Mike Beek and Supervisor Durrwachter in response to an email from Steve Bell, GMCC asking the township to assume maintenance. The Beaver family has purchased materials needed at this time. **Motion** by Kay Wampler, second by Jim Seibert to approve maintenance of the Lost Souls Memorial through the Marina – 5 ayes. **F) Auto Mark Voting Machine for Disabled Voters:** Clerk Wampler reported acceptance and training on the new voting machine was done on Tuesday evening. Training the election workers will take place in July to run the system for the August Primary.

Motion by James Seibert, second by Lois Leavenworth to approve the minutes of May 25<sup>th</sup> as presented – 4 ayes (Kay Wampler absent).

**Acceptance of Treasurer's Report:** Durrwachter accepted the Treasurers report pending audit with addition of Water Receiving update.

**Public Comment:** 7:45 p.m. Evelyn Morrison reported that the Andy Bailey Fitness and Wellness Center will be dedicated at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, July 3<sup>rd</sup> – they will open at 6:00 to the public. Also, they received another \$200 donation. Lee Durrwachter noted that the money from the State for the Well has been approved and is on its way. Donna Oglevie asked about the credit/Debit Card resolution and it's purpose – what was being paid and how?

**Adjournment:** Motion by Lois Leavenworth and seconded by James Seibert to adjourn the meeting at 7:51 p.m. – 5 ayes

### Another \$1.5 million for Grand Marais Harbor

Senator Carl Levin's office called last evening to announce the Senate Appropriations Committee unanimously approved the Energy and Water Appropriations bill that included another \$1.5 million for Grand Marais Harbor of Refuge Replacement Breakwater for the Corps of Engineers. This committee is the biggest hurdle to overcome to gain funding. Final approval will bring Congressional support to this project to over \$3 Million in the past six months. Senator Levin has championed this cause for us, as well as Senator Debbie Stabenow, Representative Bart Stupak, State Senator Michael Prusi, State Representative Stephan Adamini, Governor Jennifer Granholm, and YOU, the Citizens of Grand Marais. The above announcement was released by the Burt Township Board on June, 30, 2006

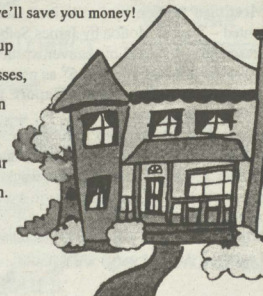

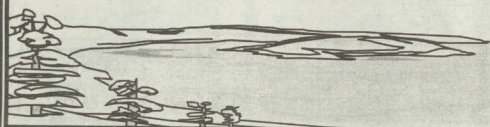

## NMU BOARD SETS TUITION

MARQUETTE – The Northern Michigan University Board of Trustees today approved a tuition and fee schedule for 2006-07.

The annual cost for full-time resident undergraduate students will increase by 4.8 percent. They will pay \$6,141, which is \$283 more than the previous year. Nonresident undergraduates will pay \$10,077, an increase of \$475. The annual rate for full-time graduate students will total \$4,981 for Michigan residents, up \$227 from a year ago, and \$7,333 for nonresidents, which represents a \$339 increase.

“We’ll be able to maintain the quality of our programs and sustain efforts in a number of initiatives while keeping the tuition increase modest,” said NMU President Les Wong. “I think it’s a sign of our board’s confidence in the administration to steward the financial resources as efficiently as possible.”

NMU administrators presented the board with three different tuition models for consideration, with increases ranging from 4.8 to 5.8 percent. Each was developed around a tentative agreement reached by the governor, House and Senate to boost Northern’s state appropriation by 3 percent, or \$1.3 million.

Trustees authorized the lowest option by a 6-2 vote. Karl Weber of Marquette, chair of the board, supported the motion.

“The bottom line for me is keeping Northern affordable for everyone,” Weber said. “I didn’t want to get into the argument that just because other universities have announced higher tuition increases, Northern should move in that direction, too.”

In casting one of the two nay votes, Trustee Jon LaSalle of Marquette said he would have favored the middle-ground increase of 5.1 percent.

“The three-tenths of one percent difference wouldn’t have substantially impacted students, but the additional revenue would have enabled the administration to catch up on deferred maintenance, equipment replacement and some of the other needs it has put off in recent years because of budgetary shortfalls. I was also in favor of the higher rate as a hedge against the legislative process we’ve seen lately of putting out an appropriation figure for planning purposes, then pulling money away from universities after they’ve set tuition.”

In developing the tuition models, administrators also assumed a net increase in general fund expenditures of \$3.5 million. This covers rising costs associates with contracted compensation adjustments and utilities, along with \$675,000 in mandated support for the Michigan Public School Employee Retirement System (MPSERS) and \$375,000 in additional student labor costs as a result of the state’s minimum wage hike.

The NMU administration is expected to present a detailed FY2007 general fund budget for approval at the board’s next regularly scheduled meeting Aug. 10-11.

**Winter Survey Results Show  
Increase in Wolf Population**

Department of Natural Resources officials today announced that a winter survey of Michigan's wolf population indicates there are at least 434 wolves roaming the Upper Peninsula. This represents an increase from the 405 animals counted in 2005. Wolf surveys are conducted during winter months when wolf numbers are at their lowest.

Last winter, DNR biologists worked with the US Department of Agriculture's Wildlife Services conducting the wolf survey. More than 2,000 hours were spent using tracking, aerial observations of packs of radio-collared wolves, and other evidence to determine the number of animals. The DNR regularly monitors approximately 50 wolves that have been fitted with radio collars to determine their movements and survival. A track survey in the northern Lower Peninsula did not confirm the presence of any wolves. In October and November of 2004, the presence of three wolves was documented in Presque Isle County, representing the first confirmation of wolves in the Lower Peninsula in more than 60 years.

Wolves dispersing from Canada, Minnesota and Wisconsin were occasionally present in the UP during the 1960s through the 1980s. Reestablishment of a resident population appears to have begun in 1989 when three animals established a territory in the western UP. Since 1989, the wolf population has increased every year except 1997, when a small population decline was noted.

The DNR encourages citizens to report any wolf sightings. Individuals who see a wolf, find a wolf track or discover other evidence of wolf can contact any DNR office to obtain a wolf observation report form. The form and more information also can be found on the DNR Web site at [www.michigan.gov/dnr](http://www.michigan.gov/dnr) under the Wildlife Species menu of the Wildlife and Habitat section.

In the event of wolf depredation on livestock or domestic pets or other wolf-related problems, citizens should call the Report All Poaching (RAP) Line at 800-292-7800. The number is staffed 24 hours a day and operators are instructed to route calls to the proper personnel.
