I am an early riser, up long before the sun. Living in Grand Marais I have the opportunity to head out to either the beach or the 'point' and watch the sunrise. It is always kind of exciting to be out there watching and seeing a freighter come over the horizon with all of its lights blazing. It looks like a small village out in the middle of that vast lake. I have imagined, how when it is dark out on the water and the lake may be raising one of its fits, what it must be like for the sailors on those freighters to see the lights of Grand Marais. Not just the warning light on the point, but the lights of the village sitting there low on their horizon. 


