## TUGBOAT SENECA'S TROUBLES CONTINUE



Sunday's heavy seas forced suspension of recovery efforts on the Seneca near Deer Park. The tug, mired in sand twenty two miles east of Grand Marais, ran aground when it came loose from the Susan Hoey during a storm December 3. The Susan Hoey sought refuge in the Grand Marais Harbor.

Saturday, members of the Atlantic Strike Team of the U.S. Coast Guard from Fort Dix, NJ were overseeing the operations while welders fabricated special hatch covers on a working barge. Divers from Ryba Marine in Cheboygan donned dry suits to go into the frigid waters, and the tug Osprey from Purvis Marine in Ontario shuttled tired workers to a support boat for rest; warmth, and food.

The recovery effort involved environmental crews from Detroit, Ft. Lauderdale, FL, and St. Ignace. Of primary concern was pollution prevention; the teams were able to remove close to 1900 gallons of diesel fuel and other hazardous materials. On the beach, the only evidence of their efforts is a tiny amount of fiber used to contain a small amount of fuel that leaked when the seas washed over the stranded tugboat.

Saturday night the crane attempted to remove sand from around the tug, but heavy waves endangered the barge and efforts to pull out the tug had to be abandoned. The equipment is gone from the remote beach and the tug continues to be engulfed by waves. Will winter seas make the tug one more relic on the shipwreck coast?


#### GRAND MARAIS WOMEN'S CLUB 2006 CHRISTMAS POTLUCK

2. Vote to Elect a Township Supervisor ~ Clerk read letter of intent from Jack Hubbard as the only person to submit a letter for the position. Motion by Howard Baker, Second by Gloria Lundquist to appoint Jack Hubbard as the Supervisor – near unanimous show of hands, 0 nays – moderator declared motion passed.

3. Vote to Elect a Township Treasurer ~ Clerk read letters and résumés from Brent Hammer, Joe Venturato and Marc Oglevie. The floor was opened for nominations:
