

Chairperson Corkin called the Committee of the Whole Departmental Budget Hearings to order. Present: Comm. Angeli, Comm. Arsenault, Comm. Bergdahl, Comm. Braamse, Comm. Joseph, Comm. Minelli, Comm. Potvin, Comm. Seppanen, Comm. Trudell, and Comm. Corkin. Absent: None. Also present for the entire budget hearings were Dennis Aloia, County Administrator and Gary Yoder, Finance Manager.

Chairperson Corkin opened the meeting for public comment. None was forthcoming.

Administrator Aloia previously distributed his recommended General Fund and Capital Improvement Fund Budget for 1994 to Commissioners and all Departments. His recommendation is for a General Fund Budget of \$11,963,247 and a Capital Improvements Fund Budget of \$477,764, total recommended budget FY 1994 is \$12,440,011. Administrator Aloia had to reduce budget requests by 14.7% or \$2,140,867.

Revenues are projected to amount to the \$11,963,247 (an increase of 3.79%), while expenditures have increased by \$227,912 over the 1993, (approximately 1.9%). Overall taxes, which provide over 50% of County revenues, have increased in the past five years by 18.21% or approximately 3.5% a year. License and permits, which provide less than 3% of County revenues, have increased by only 3.31% in the last five years. The largest percentage increase of 37.84% has occurred in charges for services which provide about 13% of County revenues, where the County has implemented user fee programs over the past five years. This year also includes an increased reliance upon the tax delinquent revolving fund.

General property taxes were frozen by the legislature last year. Under Headlee legislation, general property taxes can only increase 3% (the rate of inflation) while the assessed values in the County have increased in excess of 4% each of the last two years. Because of the freeze the County cannot recoup more than 1.5% for each of the last two years. This will cost the County \$500,000 in revenues for the 1994 budget year. In other revenues specific ore taxes were down approximately \$70,000, and interest on investments are down by approximately \$60,000 as a result of the low interest rates.

On the expenditure side, the salary increases approved by the County Board for 1994 will be the largest increase of approximately \$490,000. Also 1994 is an election year, and it is state mandated that the County appropriate approximately \$85,000 towards elections. In addition, hospitalization costs are expected to increase by \$238,000 in 1994, a result of the poor experience that we have had in Marquette County in the last several years. The 1994 General Fund Budget also includes a payment of 2% to the retirement fund.

As a result of revenues not keeping pace with requests for appropriations and Administrator Aloia is recommending that 11.75 positions be eliminated from the general fund saving \$364,647. Also 3 additional positions will be eliminated from the County Health Department as a result of cutting their appropriation by \$118,245. Administrator Aloia also recommends requested additional personnel not be granted, and has further reduced appropriations to various other funds amounting to \$391,795, with miscellaneous line item reductions amounting to \$184,436. Total adjustments to budget requests amounts to \$1,175,742.

Chairperson Corkin requested that Commissioners note any items they would like to further discuss after the Departmental Budget Hearing are completed. A list can be developed so the County Board will deal with

possible changes in order to expedite the budget process. The format for the Departmental Budget Hearings is as follows: Administrator Aloia will first speak to his recommendation for each Department, then the Department Heads will present their budget requests to the Committee of the Whole. Commissioners can then ask questions and discuss departmental budget details.

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The Committee of the Whole then reviewed the County Board of Commissioners' Budget. The consensus was to lower the travel line item by \$1,000 and increase the memberships line item by \$1,000, and then include the \$1,500 annual membership to UPCAP.

Other line item adjustments would include the fine tuning of the cigarette tax revenues and the state convention and liquor tax revenues, which half is appropriated for U.P. Substance Abuse Services. It was noted that the Soil and Water Conservation District requested \$10,000 but received no appropriation from the General Fund Budget, however, \$5,000 is budgeted for the S & WCD out of the forestry fund. The Committee of the Whole consensus was also that repayment of the loan by the Marquette County Fair be reduced by \$10,000.

Comm. Seppanen noted that budget work sessions in past years were necessary to provide funding for special appropriations, and to prioritize the Capital Budgets, however, for this year it is not necessary. Comm. Seppanen is ready to move the Administrator's FY 1994 recommended budget be sent to the annual meeting. Comm. Joseph wanted to explore additional budget cuts of \$200,000 to \$400,000. Comm. Braamse was uncomfortable with funding the E.D.C. while laying off County employees. She thought using the tax delinquent revolving fund to avoid layoffs was best. Comm. Potvin believed several items needed further debate, such as non-mandated vs. mandated programs, Sheriff's vehicle, comp. time for non-union employees, and the Administrator's contract. Comm. Corkin pointed out that Administrator Aloia has requested no salary increase or changes in his contract which expires in June of 1994.

It was moved by Comm. Seppanen, seconded by Comm. Arsenault and carried on a roll call vote, 7 ayes (Comm. Seppanen, Comm. Angeli, Comm. Arsenault, Comm. Bergdahl, Comm. Minelli, Comm. Trudell, and Comm. Corkin) to 3 nays (Comm. Braamse, Comm. Joseph, and Comm. Potvin), that the Committee of the Whole recommend the FY 1994 General Fund Budget and the 1994 Capital Improvements Budget as recommended by Administrator Aloia, (with minor adjustments noted above) for presentation to the Annual County Board Meeting on October 12, 1993 as follows:
