think we will have fish
to eat twice a week now
because its lenten season.
A new patient came in
yesterday so every bed is

full now. This patient is
about 6 ft. 3 inches tall.
He worked in the Public
Garage in Calumet. He got
T. B. in the hip. I think
Ironwood won the cup for
playing hockey because they
beat Calumet 2 and 1 last
night. Did you read about
the raise C & H gave to all
its employees. 10% helps
some but I suppose all the

The new man that came in
is an Italian now there
