

Bruce Francour Drowning Victim

Bruce Francour, 15, son of Mr. and Mrs. George Francour, drowned in Little Cedar River in Stephenson, last Thursday evening about 7.55 p.m. while swimming with a group of his friends.

He was missed by his friends after an absence of 15 minutes, when his innereabouts could not be determined. The State Police Post was notified and responded. A search of the Little Cedar was organized with Donald Wangerin, George Szabo and Richard Staples as volunteers Within minutes the hody was located and intensive work was started to revive the boy.

Francour was swimming in the Stephenson "swimming hole" at the time. The swimming site is used by county youngsters during the summer months and it is supervised by a lifeguard. The lifeguard was our duty at the time of the accident, however.

Bruce Edward Francour was born April 28, 1945, in Menominee. He would have entered Stephenson High School this fall as a freshman. Active in baseball, he pitched for one of the teams of Menominee County Junior program.



Menominee County's first hunting fatality occurred Saturday when the body of Michael Cole, 16, of Daggett, was found in the woods three miles behind his farm home by his father, Raymond Cole.

The boy had left home early in the morning to go hunting and when he did not return in the evening, his father began a search for him. He had been shot through the head with a 30-30 rifle.

State Police, who are still investigating, said he apparently was killed by his own rifle. The rifle was found under the body.




Donald J. Johnson, 35, Rt. 1, Daggett, died unexpectedly, Oct. 10 at Menominee County Lloyd Hospital.

Richard Gordon Majkrzak, 35, Wallace, died this morning as the result of an automobile accident.



The Class of 1964 began its journey toward graduation in the Fall of 1951. Across the middle of Menominee county from the Menominee River to the Bay of Lake Michigan in Cedar River, we entered the doors of one or two room township schools, church fellowship halls and basements. The towns with larger numbers like Stephenson moved our class around; Kindergarten in the Methodist Community Hall behind the Methodist Church, then first grade in an empty classroom at the High School, Second and Third Grade at the Grant School in Palestine, and back to the High School for Fourth grade.

The children from the Wallace area have a similar history. They entered Kindergarten in a small school building then progressed for First grade to a church in Wallace. Their Second and Third grade years were spent in the Ingalls School and another building for Fourth grade.

Children in Cedar River, Greenwoods and Daggett seemed to remain in one building until they attended Stephenson Consolidated Schools. Lake township had 3 classrooms in operation during this time. In Fifth grade students in Stephenson attended a new K-6 Elementary School . The students from the Wallace area attended their new K-8 building. The children attending Cedar River School , Lake township, and Greenwoods School transferred to Stephenson in Seventh Grade. Students at Daggett Elementary and Mellen Elementary joined Stephenson in their Freshman year. Along the way all the groups of children lost members who moved away or gained members who moved into the District.

By our Freshman year, 1960, we were the Class of 1964.

I hope you enjoy the walk down memory lane as you look at our pictures and remember a simpler, less complicated time in our lives.

The building was moved across the Little Cedar River when the ice was thick enough to accomodate it. It was also used for church suppers, ladies' aid meetings, Sunday School classes, youth gatherings, etc. The church has since expanded into the area where the Community House once stood.





In 1902, Victor and Mary Decaine deeded a piece of property to the Township of Stephenson School District. The property was to be used for a school. In 1910, Lake Township was created out of part of Stephenson Township. In the early 1920s, the Edison School, located



just west of Stephenson on G-12, was opened as one of three at that time in Lake Township. At first, students in grades kindergarten through eighth were taught there. Later, the school went through the sixth grade. It was closed at the end of the 1958-59 school year. Ann Linderoth was the last teacher at the school. Eventually, Lake Township became part of the Stephenson Consolidated School District. In 1956-57, Cecelia Parrett, standing in back row, was the teacher. We made the news



■ Stephenson defeated Newberry, 34-6. This was the first football game that was ever filmed by Stephenson.

Joe Petrin scored two touchdowns for the

Eagles.

In this game, I thought our wide receiver was going down the sideline, but as I released the football he cut toward the middle of the field,

making my pass a pass to nobody.

In the film session there was a lot of amusement at my expense. Coach Axel Anderson kept going forward and backward with the projector, and then he finally said, "other than that being the best pass that I ever saw you throw, I want to know who you were throwing the pass to?

I met coach Anderson in 1958 when he was hired as the football coach at Stephenson. I was riding my horse in the Ingalls area and he was lost and looking for the home of Jim and Don Erickson, two prospective football players, Anderson asked me if I knew where they lived, I said I didn't even know who they were. He gave me a look like "you sure don't know very much," and I gave him a look like "at least I'm not lost."

■ Eventual Barber Trophy winner, Escanaba Holy Name, defeated Stephenson 7-0. No. 2 Kingsford defeated Stephenson at Stephenson. Dick Berlinski scored for Kingsford. No. 3 Gladstone defeated Stephenson at Stephenson, 26-19. Harry Westrich scored on a run. Jon Wangerin threw touchdown passes to Westrich and Joe Turek. Manistique defeated Stephenson at Stephenson, 19-13. Mike Dissinger caught a touchdown pass for Manistique. Wangerin passed to Clarence Peterson for a touchdown and Wayne Thoney scored on a long run.

There were some outstanding players to play at Stephenson in 1962, Berlinski and Dissinger went on to Michigan State. They played in the 'Game Of The Century" against Notre Dame in

■ Dick Yenchesky, who had a 18-2 record in his only season as a head varsity basketball coach, resigned his position at Wausaukee to go into school administration.

Yenchesky never coached again, but his .900 winning percentage in varsity basketball competition has to be one of the top lifetime winning percentages in state history.

- Escanaba defeated Menominee and Stephenson in a triangular track meet at Walton Blesch Field. Clarence Peterson of Stephenson won the pole vault with a height of 11'3", Paul Dougovito of Stephenson won the 440-yard-dash.
- The Stephenson Eagles behind sophomore righthander Roger Wood, defeated Escanaba 8 to 1. Wood fanned nine and walked two.

■ Jerry Lutri of Stephenson won the Great Lakes Conference high jump title.

Lutri, an outstanding all-around athlete, did not have the typical slim high-jumper's build. When Lutri was drafted as an offensive lineman out of Northern Michigan University by the Dallas Cowboys, he was 6foot-4, 265 pounds and wore a size 15 shoe.

When Jerry would run up to the high jump bar it would sound like a herd of buffalo but when he left the ground he was like a big feather flying in the air.

- The Stephenson Eagles won the district tournament with a 76-59 win over Kingsford. Craig Sundquist led Stephenson with 21 points. Ron Graves contributed 11 points for the Eagles.
- Coach Bob Kuntze's Carney-Nadeau Wolves defeated Vulcan 87-60. Bob Macco scored 20 points and Earl LaCount 17 points for the Wolves, who lost only one regular season game.
- Coach Dick Yenchesky's Wausaukee Rangers defeated Bay Port.
- Kuntze and Yenchesky are hunting, fishing and golfing buddies and talked of the two schools, only a little over 30 miles apart, playing one another.
