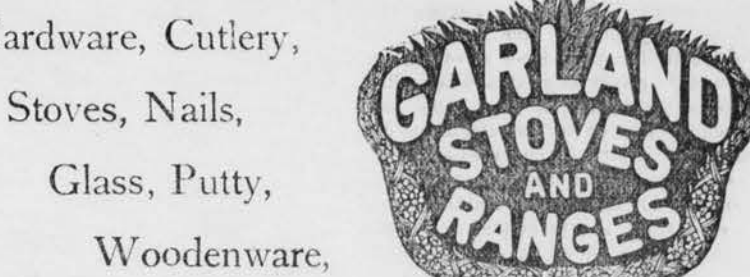

BUCKWHEAT CAKES. Dissolve one cake of Acme compressed yeast in one and one-half quarts of water or milk, add teaspoonful salt, two tablespoonfuls molasses or sugar, two tablespoonfuls wheat flour, and sufficient buckwheat flour (about two quarts) to make batter. Let rise over night, in the morning thin, if necessary, and fry on griddle. If wanted quick, use double quantity of yeast.

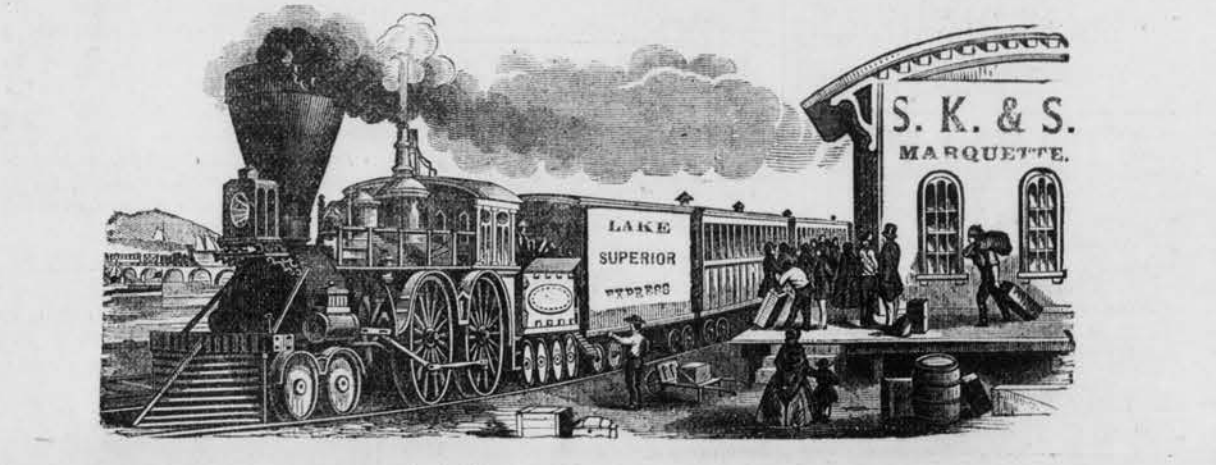
