CEMETERY AND FENCE.

Street Improvements, Park Cemetery and Mrs. Mallette's Fence Occupy Attention of Common Council.

TWO FISHERMEN MEET MANIAC WANDERING ON SUPERIOR'S SHORE.

Two Judges to Preside in United States Courts This Term—You Can Safely Tell About That Mortgage.

Streets, Cemetery and a Fence. The common council held a comparatively short session last evening most of which was occupied with street improvement matters with incidental digressions upon Park cemetery and Mrs. Mallette's fence. Bergh & Hetting were allowed \$1,000 on the trunk sewer work but the council refused to consider a number of orders given by those contractors to their creditors.

The special assessment rolls for Fourth street from Hewitt avenue to the north line of Palmer's addition and for the Arch street sewer were confirmed. Profiles were adopted and ordinances passed for the grading and macadamizing of Lincoln and Seymour avenues from Washington to Ridge street. A sidewalk was ordered built on the south side of Jackson street from Champion to Altamont street.

Alderman Hennessey gave notice to the committee on parks, cemeteries and public grounds that he would at the next meeting call for a report on the money expended and proposed to be expended on Park Cemetery. He thought this thing of the park commissioner coming in year after year with a deficiency bill for \$1,400 to \$1,800 was played out. The park commissioners should ask the council to appropriate money and let it know what became of the money expended by him. The council had been left in total ignorance of these matters. The cemetery committee agreed to get the desired report.

Then Alderman Hennessey wanted to know why Mrs. Mallette's fence, at the corner of Superior and Third streets and alleged to be infringing upon the highway, had not been removed. He graphically described the tribulations of himself and Engineer Cummings in running lines from the brownstone quarry to Presque Isle and from Lake Superior to Eagle Mills to determine the latitude and longitude of that fence and wound up with a resolution requesting, directing, ordering and commanding the city attorney to have the fence retired to its proper position. The council then adjourned.

He Should be Looked After. Two gentlemen of this city while out fishing Sunday found a man apparently demented wandering along the lake shore about ten miles east of town. He was apparently from 25 to 30 years of age and seemed from his speech to be of English birth. He said his name was James Smith and it was gathered from his talk that he was trying to make his way home to some mining town, the name of which he did not give. He wore a brown plaid coat, a black stoucho hat and dark trousers. When asked if he knew where was, what lake he was on, he replied that it was the Black Sea and launched out into a rambling discourse upon that body of water. He was travelling eastward and was without food in a desolate neighborhood. A silver table spoon protruded from his inside vest pocket.

The gentlemen who found the wanderer were convinced from his talk and actions that he was insane and tried to persuade him to come with them back to the city but were unable to do so. He said that he did not think much of Marquette as there were only two or three houses there, but that Marquette, a little further on, was quite a place. From this it was supposed that he had been an inmate of the almshouse and had escaped. Poormaster Barney said last night, however, that none of the unfortunates under his charge were missing. While obviously demented, Smith did not seem inclined to be violent. If any such person is missing his friends had better look after him as he is likely to wander along the uninhabited shore until overcome by starvation or, should his mania prove violent, do mischief to some one.

Two Judges to Preside. The United States circuit and district courts will open to-day with Judge Severens of this district and Judge Sage of the southern district of Ohio upon the bench. A number of important cases, both civil and criminal, are to come up this term. The only criminal case as yet placed upon the public docket is that of James Connors, charged with robbing the Calumet postoffice. It is understood however, that District Attorney Palmer has several other offenders on the string whose cases may be taken up.

The ejectment case of the Michigan Land and Iron company against Levi Cunningham will be taken up some time during the session. Don M. Dickinson of Detroit, who appears for Cunningham, is now in the city and the fame of the advocate will doubtless attract many auditors to the court room.

The Bessemer Consolidated Iron company case, which has already gone the rounds of half of the courts of Wisconsin and Michigan, has now entered the

federal tribunals and promises to be as long drawn out as the celebrated Pe-wabic case, now about to be finally closed up. Altogether the session promises to be an interesting one from the great interest involved and on account of the presence of several notable advocates.

Concerning Your Mortgages. The census bureau is making vigorous efforts to ascertain how much there is in the cry, so common of late years, that the lands of this country, particularly the farms, are plastered with mortgages. To that end four counties in each state have been selected for a test of the mortgage question. Special agents have made search of the records and persons against whom unencumbered mortgages are found are requested, by letter, to answer the following questions:

Was this mortgage fully paid January 1, 1890?
If not fully paid, how much was unpaid upon the principal January 1 1890.
Was this mortgage made to secure part of purchase money, to make improvements, or for what other purpose; or if made to renew a previous mortgage, what was the debt originally created for?
Accompanying this question slip is an assurance from Superintendent Robert P. Porter that the information so obtained will be kept strictly secret, as the law directs. Hence no one need have the slightest hesitancy in filling out the slip and returning it in the official envelope accompanying it. Marquette is one of the counties selected for this test, the others being in the farming regions of the lower peninsula.
