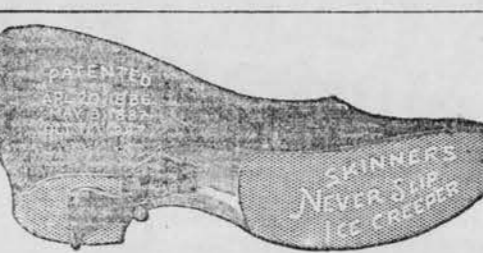
TRICKS OF OPERATORS.
RAILROAD "E"LEGRAPHERS USED TO GET A LITTLE SLEEP.
A Possible Explanation of Some Terrible Wrecks—Most Men Realize the Grave Responsibility Which Is Upon Them—A Boy's Costly Sleep.
The most undesirable work and the least remunerative among telegraphers is that of night operator at some lonely station on a railroad. The rules of the company require that these men shall remain awake at their posts from 7 p. m. till 7 a. m. to report passing trains, and to receive and deliver such orders as it may be necessary to convey to engineers and conductors to regulate the movement of their trains. On double track roads their presence at their posts is of great importance in emergency, and to be sure they are always on hand. A system of signaling is in vogue on most roads by which every operator is required to report by wire to headquarters every half hour during the night.

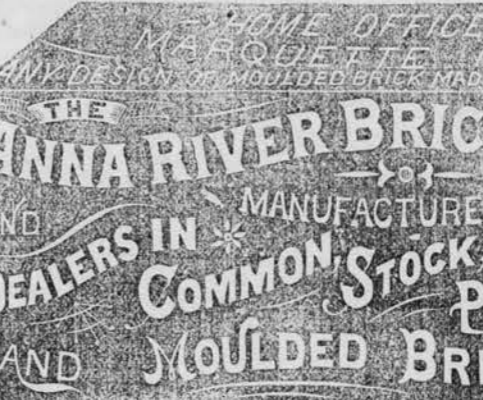
Wanted Bed and Influenza.

Regimental Field Telegraph.
An ingenious field telegraph has been invented by an English judge. The coils of double insulated wire, giving a complete metallic circuit, wound on bobbins, are supported on the backbones of two bicycles. Six poles, to enable the troops to carry the wires over roads, are supported over the handles of the bicycles, which are trundled one in front of the other. When the wire is to be laid the bobbins are taken off and carried on the back and wound off, a special rapid coupling being provided in case of necessity. When on the road the poles can be thrown off and the bicycles mounted, so that the instruments and the conducting wires can be carried off and saved from capture.—New York Telegraph.
