The Board of Supervisors of the County of Marquette respectfully show that they have audited and paid the expenses of the military company belonging to the City of Marquette during the strike at the City of Peshigo in July last and that they have not audited the expenses of the two military companies from the City of Detroit belonging the State of Michigan and not the County of Marquette to be liable therefor -

The Board of supervisors aforesaid further show that they are willing and they believe that the people of Marquette County are ready and willing to pay all their legal obligations and to that end the Board respectfully represents that it has authorized its chairman to accept service of process immediately and agree with the State authorities to submit the matter to the Supreme Court at its present term and if the decision is adverse to Marquette County the said Expenses of sending
