To the Board of Supervisors

Gentlemen.

At your request I attended the meeting of the state Board of Equalization, held at Lansing on the 15th of August. About sixty of the Counties of the State were represented and the errand and purpose of each representative, was to get the valuation of his county reduced, or at least to keep it from being increased. Every representative declared that the appraisements in his County were made at the true cash value of the property, and some contended, and attempted to show that valuations were really above a true value. Upon this subject I endeavored to be silent, but when questioned, I was unable to declare that such was the fact in this County. I did, however, try to show to the Board, that our valuation was too high, and that injustice had been done to us heretofore in this regard.

I think I succeeded reasonably well.

The result shows that while our valuation was increased 25% the valuation of the State at large was increased 28.6%, and this

although we report an increase in acreage of over 400,000 acres.

I remember that in 1876 I was a member of the Board of Supervisors of this County, that when this subject was then discussed in the Board, in view of the then approaching session of this State Board, I urged upon the Assessors to observe the law in relation of the appraisement of property at its true cash value as an evidence of our good faith. That advice was not followed then, and, if I am correctly informed, has not been observed since.

I am certain that this disregard of law operates to our prejudice before the State Board, and whether it be true or not as alleged, that the law is observed in other Counties, I take the liberty again to urge upon the members of this Board, who act as assessing officers, that they hereafter make their valuations in accordance with law, and I am satisfied that the result will be much more satisfactory and creditable.

In the discharge of this mission, I was absent from my office five days. I herewith send my bill, including expenses \$150.00; which I ask you to allow.

Adame is a gentleman I think very much of, and would not wish him any wrong but would like to see him sharpened up and come when is wanting, as we up here think it of great importance. Now gentlemen I hope you will act on this and give it your attention.

Reports of Committees.

By the Committee on County officers accounts,
To the Board of Supervisors.
Gentlemen.

Since the last meeting of the board, your committee on County officers accounts were informed by some of the County Treasurers bondsmen that they had reason to believe John E. Ward County Treasurer to

a defaulter in office to a considerable amount, and said bondsmen requested your Committee to make an immediate investigation without waiting for the board to assemble. Your Committee immediately proceeded to examine the treasurer's books and accounts, and after several days spent in such examination found that the treasurer was a defaulter to the extent of Eighteen thousand dollars, and upwards. The treasurer himself admitted the defalcation to your committee, and claims to have been ignorant that he was a defaulter until a few days previously and expressed a desire to resign his office which he accordingly did and such resignation is now on file with the County Clerk. Your committee then took immediate steps to convene a meeting of this Board for the purpose of taking action in the premises and in the mean time placed an officer in charge of the treasurer's office. In the absence of the prosecuting attorney, legal adviser of the board. Your Committee consulted private counsel, Mr W^m P. Healey, and have thus far acted under legal advice in the interests of the County. Your Committee are of the opinion that the interests of the County will not be prejudiced in accepting the resignation of the treasurer. Public policy does not require that a defaulter shall be continued in office even for the purpose of investigating his accounts, such investigation can be made equally as well when his successor is appointed. Your Committee therefore recommend that the resignation of John E. Ward County treasurer be accepted, that a successor be appointed and immediate steps be taken to secure the County from loss.
