On presenting a report of such visit to the Board of Corrections and Charities the secretary was instructed to furnish your board with an abstract of the same. You will find it enclosed.

Abstract of report made by the secretary of the Board of Corrections and Charities of a visit made to the jail of Marquette county, July 11, 1883

"This jail is not well constructed, to secure proper ventilation. The block of cells in the center is close, dark and with no ventilation except by grated doors. The windows in the hall surrounding the cells being high. In winter, when the jail is full, the air must be very bad. Though they have the hotly water there is no bath tub, ^{and} no requirements as to bathing. The water pipes were leaking badly. When visited the cell part of the jail was badly crowded at the time. With but 6 cells, there were 14 prisoners. Another part of the jail, for detention of boys, women, insane ^{and} persons charged with slight offences, or as witnesses is much better lighted and ventilated. In this part there were but 5 prisoners - one woman, one partially insane, one detained as witness, ^{and} two drunk ^{and} disorderly, serving out short sentences. This part, as well ~~the~~ walls ^{and} floors, as the beds ^{and} bedding, was clean. The cell part might have been improved in that respect. I was surprised at the large number who had been committed since January 1st / 1888, during 9th of whom 29 were committed for being drunk and disorderly. This growing ^{and} wealthy county will, we trust, soon supply itself with a jail of larger size and of better construction, especially with regard to light, ventilation ^{and} facilities for enforcing personal cleanliness by washing ^{and} bathing.
