THE FAILURE OF THE PEACH CROP.

THE FIRST ELECTRICAL MILL TRAMROAD.

The Thomson-Houston company has completed and put into operation the first electric mill tramroad in Chicago, at the works of the Northwestern Tannery Cotta company. The line is 1,700 feet long, including the loop. The overhead conductor consists of two No. 2 B. & S. gauge copper wires. As the power is supplied from an incandescent lighting plant it was deemed advisable not to use one wire and rail for return current, so a double trolley system was installed. The line has six curves of less than forty feet radius.
