Gentlemen:
Your committee on Superintendants of the poor would respectfully report that on Feb 13th they made an inspection of the County Poor House. They found Mr Samuel Parney and his amiable wife in charge of the affairs of the institution. The inmates at present consist of 19 males and 4 females, making 23 in all, a much smaller number than they usually have. and from investigation we found the affairs of the institution were being conducted in an able and efficient manner

Your committee would further report that upon examination they found the building in a very bad and dilapidated condition throughout! so much so that we would urge that immediate steps be taken to prepare plans to re-arrange and put the old building in good repair as soon as warm weather sets in in the spring, or to build a new one, of the two, your committee would strongly advise the building of a new one. and in order that the board may be enabled to act more intelligently in the matter, we would recommend that a special committee of three be appointed, with authority to engage an architect to go over the old building and report more thoroughly than your committee possibly could do as to its condition and needs, at our next meeting; and also be prepared to give us an idea as to what the cost of a new building would be, of such size and dimensions as would likely be required within the next 25 years, all of which is respectfully submitted.
