Gentlemen:-

You will find enclosed a statistical survey of the agricultural townships of Cloverland, which is the fifteen counties of the Upper Peninsula of Michigan.

I hope you will examine this carefully, as it is the most reliable report the Bureau can make of its efforts.

The work of the Bureau is a commercial proposition, and its duties are to educate the people in other states and acquaint them with the opportunties that exist in Clover-land for general farming, fruit growing, dairying, cattle raising and truck growing, also opportunities for commercial and manufacturing enterprises.

If you will stop for a moment and reflect you will agree that it is not reasonable for farmers in Ohio, Wisconsin, Indiana and Illinois to come here and locate without reliable information is furnished them regarding Clover-land, the same as furnished by the two hundred and fifty or more development bureaus in other states, all seeking to increase their rural population.

In the two years that the Bureau has been in existence, according to your own reports of each township, there has been 2804 families located on agricultural lands, which on a basis of four to a family shows an increase in rural population of 11,216, and these 2804 families have purchased 249,678 acres of land for farming purposes.

You will agree with me that this increase would not have come to us if it had not been through the efforts of the successful publicity furnished by the Upper Peninsula Development. Bureau.

An appropriation from your county is needed in order to sustain and enlarge the work of the Bureau. Can you afford to withdraw your support for work of this character.

Many believe that this kind of work is only profitable to the land men, but every new family locating in your township is worth \$600.00 revenue per year. This estimate comes from the United States Department of Commerce and Labor, and all the people in your township derive a direct and indirect benefit through the spending of this \$500.00

I feel assured that when a resolution comes before your board of supervisors for an appropriation to the Upper Peninsula Development Bureau it will receive your earnest supper ort, as the Bureau can not exist without it can receive the financial support of your county to help pay its operating expenses.

The following was adopted as the constitution of the Marquette County Farm Bureau.

Constitution of the Marquette County Farm Bureau.

Name: This organization shall be known as the Marquette County Farm Bureau.

Purpose: The purpose of this organization is to develop the agricultural resources and to promote the best social educational industrials interests of the country.

Membership: All persons residing within the county are eligible to membership and

become members upon paying the annual fee and subscripting to the constitution.

Fees and Dues: A minimum annual fee of 50c shall be charged for membership in this Bureau, but there shall be no restriction on voluntary subscriptions by the Finance Committee for special purposes.

Officers: The officers of this bureau shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and County Agriculturist all of whom, except the County Agriculturist, shall be elected for a period of one year and shall serve, without compensation until their successors shall be elected and qualify. The County Agriculturist shall be appointed for such time and given such compensation as the contracting parties may determine.

Advisory Board: The Advisory Board shall constitute the governing body of the Bureau and shall be composed of the officers of the Bureau and one Township Director from each Township and ward in the County: in addition to this there may also be on the advisory Board one Director from each Chamber of Commerce of the different cities of the County. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the members of the Advisory Board.

Politicales

Constitution

The Township directors for the first year shall be chosen by a committee appointed by the President. After the first year all Township Directors shall be elected by the members of the Bureau residing in the respective townships. Duties of the Officers: The President shall perform such duties as usually pertain to the office. He shall have power to fill such vacancies as may occur in any office or committee. He shall in conjunction with the Treasurer, sign at checks and vouchers for disbursements, contracts and other instruments of writing of the Bureau. He may call meetings of the Advisory Board or any of the committees whenever he deems advisable; and upon the application of three members of the Advisory Board shall call special meetings provided such application is made in writing setting forth the object of the meeting.

The Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President in case of his absence or disability.

The Secretary shall perform such duties as usually pertain to the office of Secretary.

The Treasurer shall in conjunction with the President sign all checks and vouchers for disbursements, contracts, and other instruments of writing of the Bureau. He shall

deposit the funds of the Bureau in the bank or banks designated by the Advisory Board. Township Organization:: It shall be the duty of the Township Director to solicit members in his township, and to turn into the Treasurer of the Bureau all membership fees received Hebshall call together all the farmers of his township, and others residing in his township interested in the development of agriculture, and affect a Township Organization of the Bureau of which he shall be the director and Presiding officer. The Organization shall be a Secretary and a Treasurer both of whom shall be chosen from the members of the Bureau residing in that township.

Object of Township Organization: The object of the Township Organization is, in general to make the work of the County Agriculturist more efficient in that particular community Committees: The standing committees of this Bureau shall be: The Executive Committee, which shall consist of the officers of the Bureau and two members at large chosen by the Advisory Board: the Finance Committee and the Marketing Committee, both of which shall consist of three members appointed by the President: and such other committees as the Advisory Board may deem necessary to the efficiency of the work.

Duties of the Committee: The Executive Committee shall transact such business of the

Bureau as the Advisory Board may direct.

The Finance Committee shall audit the books of the Treasurer, and shall solicit and collect all funds, other than membership fes, necessary to carry out the work of

The Marketing Committee shall make a study of the markets effecting the county and report their finding in writing to the Bureau.

The duties of the Committees-may be determined by the Advisory Board.

Meetings: The Advisory Board shall hold regular monthly meetings at such place and hour as it may determine. The annual meetings shall be held on the date of the regular monthly meeting in the month of September.

Order of Business: The order of business of the Advisory Board shall be as follows: roll call, reading of minutes, report of committees and consideration of same, report and recommendations of the County Agriculturist, suggestions for improving the work, Treasurer's report, new business, adjournment. In addition to this, at the annual meetings there shall be submitted in writing the annual report of the officers.

Amendments— The constitution of the Bureau may be altered or amended at any regular meetings of the Advisory would be provided that parties in writing of such annual above.

Amendments- The constitution of the Bureau may be altered or amended at any regular meeting of the Advisory Board, provided that notice in writing of such proposed change or changes had been given as the previous regular meeting. All members absent when such notice is given must be informed by the Secretary sending a copy of the proposed changes.

Gentlemen: At a meeting of your Supplies and Expenditures Committee held on this date, bids for supplying Marquette County with coal for the ensuing year were received from the following companies, Consolidated Fuel & Lumber Co., James Pickands & Co. and F.B.Spear & Sons. The same being opened it was found that the Consolidated Fuel & Lumber Co., and James Pickands & Co., had submitted the lowest bids. We therefore recommend that the

contract for coal be divided equally between them. All coal delivered to the Court House and Jail to be accepted on weight of Court House scales. Coal delivered to Morgan Heights accepted on Railroad weights.

We also recommed that the Chairman of this Committee be authorized to arrange with the Marquette Boiler & Sheet Iron Works to make all necessary repairs to the Court House Boilers.

We advise the installation of a sanitary drinking fountain at foot of steps leading to Court Room, and placing of sanitary paper towels in all the toilet rooms. These changes to be made to comply with the laws of this State.

One hundred and seventeen persons have been inmates of the County House at different times during the year, and twenty hundred and fifty-seven persons have been aided outside the County House during the year.

Your Superintendents regret to report that we end the year with a cash balance of only \$1815.78. The past year has been exceptionally hard on the Poor Fund. We note that seven hundred fifty persons have received temporary aid during the present year more than the previous year, and our disbursements figure up to \$8684.46 more than the previous year.

Superintendent Sporley thinks the demand on him will be much lighter the ensuing year as there will be more men employed in the mines.

Superintendent Chase does not think the demands on him will be much less than the past year.

Your Superintendent also notes that the product on the Poor Farm is very much of a failure, from Mr.Stewart's report it will not be much more than half of what it was last year, so conditions do not look very promising in the First District.

We do not think it would be wise to ask an appropriation of less than \$60,000.00 with which amount we hope to be able to care for the indigent Poor of the County, also the Doctors' and Hospitals' bills.

Therefore, we respectfully request that your Honorable Body appropriate the sum of \$60,000.00 as relief for the Poor of Marquette County for the current year.

We note the following supplies on hand at the County Farm (estimated) Viz: 12 tons hay: 5 tons oat straw: 6 tons corn stalks: 25 bushels carrots: 15 bushels parsnips: 10 bushels beets: 10 bushels turnips: 1000 small head cabbage: 400 head celery: 650 bushels potatoes: and 1050 cords 16 in. wood.

I have fully completed the checking of rejected taxes, back to and including the year 1903. A large proportion of the entries made on the books for these taxes have been incorrect. Many items have erroneously been ordered re-assessed and others that should have been reassessed were omitted. No action whatever has been taken by the board as to the reassessment of any taxes, other than state and county and county road.

I would particularly call your attention to taxes which were rejected for the reason that they had been paid to city or township treasurers who failed to mark them paid on their tax rolls, returning them as delinquent to the county treasurer.

The state, county and county road taxes were in most cases charged back to the cities and townships and reassessed as rejected taxes, but no action was taken in regard to the other taxes.

All of these amounts should have been collected of the township and city treasurers who signed the receipts in a few cases this has been done but as far as I can learn in most cases little or no effort has been made to collect from them.

I have done a good deal of work on the county treasurers delinquent tax collections, redemptions and state collections, but have not fully completed checking them. This is due to the fact that the details of distributions are almost entirely lacking in the treasurers books. The figures given in this report will of course be changed by any further errors that may be discovered.

Special Auditor H.S. Thompson, read the following report, which was received and ordered filed.

Marquette, Mich., Nov. 24th, 1914.

To the Chairman and Board of Supervisors of Marquette County. Gentlemen:

I submit herewith the report of my examination of the books of the County Treasurer covering delinquent tax collections and rejected taxes for a period of ten years up to December 31st, 1914, the results of which are shown on the accompanying tabulated statement.

I have verified the cash accounting on the Treasurer's books insofar as it pertains to delinquent tax collections and rejected taxes and find that it is correct, as was certified to by Mr.J.A.Dresser.

I would recommend that the balances due to the several Cities and Townships as shown on my statement be paid to them under such conditions as may be approved by Mr.M.J.Kennedy, Prosecuting Attorney.

I find that during the entire period covered by my investigation the handling and ordering the re-assessment of rejected taxes by the Board of Supervisors has not been done in accordance with the law.

Special auditors report

The Treasurer has not furnished the Board proper lists of such taxes and the amounts which the Board has ordered re-assessed for State County and County Road taxes has been larger that it should have been.

The Treasurer furnished no lists whatever showing the amounts of City, Township School and other taxes rejected, for which reason no action has ever been taken by the Board on such taxes.

Inasmuch as a large part of such taxes if ordered re-assessed would have to be spread at large on the various cities and townships. I would recommend that no attempt he made to re-assess them at this late day.

The records of the Treasurer's office relative to the distribution of delinquent tax collections have been poorly kept for years. At times an entire month's business was omitted and many of the entries made were incorrect.

Postings to the journal have been made at irregular intervals and often omitted entirely. For the last two or three years the use of the journal had been nearly if entirely done away with.

At the time I first began my work of investigation, I found the general books of the office several months behind.

Since that time however these books have been brought much more nearly up to date. The conditions as I found them at the beginning of my work ate absolutely inexcusable and should not be permitted or tolerated.

On April 26, 1915, I submitted to the county clerk the report of H.A. Higgins to the City Commission of the City of Marquette, showing analysis made by him of the delinquent real tax account of the county with the city,

This report was accompanied by a letter from me in which I made the request of the county for \$3,697.81, in addition to the collections made by the county treasurer since December 31, 1914, and requested the clerk to "Put this request through the proper channels for investigation and action.".

The said report of Mr. Higgins showed the county treasury to be indebted to the city on account of taxes and interest collected for the city prior to January 1st, 1915, a balance of account of \$2,085.82. The other items which with said sum made up the amount of \$3,697.81, for which Mr. Higgins considered the county to be accountable to the city were on account of failures of the county treasurer and board of supervisors to properly

perform their duties in relation to the return of delinquent taxes and the reassessment of rejected taxes, which failures had caused loss to the city of taxes and the interest thereon.

Since the date of my communication above mentioned, your board has caused an investigation to be made of the books and files of the county treasurer, which investi-

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Communication and communication

gation has substablially verified the figures of Mr.Higgins as to the state of the account for taxes and interest collected and held by the county treasurer for the city, your accountant making the amount due the city \$2,089.79, or \$3.97 more than Mr.Higgins had found.

Your board has not considered and acted on any of the other matters embraced in said amount of \$3,697.81, which Mr. Higgins had considered to be due the city, your board having confined its actions solely to the account for moneys actually received by the county treasurer for the city, the balance of which amount to January 1st, 1915, your board has determined to be the said sum of \$2,089.79.

Please take notice, That the City of Marquette hereby withdraws from your consideration all items matters, claims and demands embraced in said report of Mr.Higgins, so submitted by me to the county clerk, other than such as are embraced in said balance of \$2,089.79: and that as to said balance said city renews its request that your board rescind its action, in effect instructing the county treasurer to refuse payment to said city of said admitted balance unless the city and city officials shall execute to the county releases of all claims and demands, action and causes of action, up to and including December 31,1914, While making this request the City of Marquette dees not admit that such action on the part of your board in attempting to exact a release of all claims is of any force, effect or validity, and said city does not waive its rights to insist in all actions, suits and proceedings that such action is arbitrary, unauthorized and void.
