Another thing to lessen the demand for charcoal iron is that car wheel makers can secure old car wheels at such low prices, and they are trying every way possible to decrease the quantity of pig iron in their mixture and increase the use of old wheels.

A prominent and well informed firm of pig iron brokers was asked as to the advisability of re-starting a charcoal furnace plant and what the proposed prospects were in that line. The reply of the firm was to the effect that the production of charcoal iron is not likely to be increased unless there is a decided revival among the railroads.

COPPER SALES IN 1892.

The Boston Transcript has been looking over the reports of the Lake copper companies for the last calendar year with an analytic eye, and has this comment on certain facts which they disclose: Late annual reports of Lake Superior copper mining companies for 1892 emphasize the singular fact that the Quincy, the largest of the mines which make full report for the calendar year, received the smallest average price for its copper.

In the matter of low cost of production, the Quincy easily leads, and its ability to produce, treat and market a large output—over eleven million pounds fine last year—at an exceedingly low cost doubtless accounts for the great strength of the stock, which sells at 132 1/2 in the market, a price which makes it yield on the basis of last year's dividend payments of \$9 per share only 4 1/2 per cent, while Osceola, paying \$3 per annum and selling at 35, nets 8 1/2 per cent.
