THE SUMMER OF 1816.

EXTRAORDINARY WEATHER FOR JUNE AND JULY.

Six Inches of Snow in June When People Froze to Death--Overcoats and Mittens All Summer Long--Suicides Through Fear That the Sun Was Cooling Off.

'I haven't heard much else but talk about the weather since I came to New York,' said Nonagenarian James Winchester of Vermont, who is visiting his daughter in this city.

'That snowstorm of June 17 was one of the severest ones I ever saw, even in the depth of winter in that locality of severe snows. An uncle of mine had some sheep in a back pasture lot. To get to that lot he had to go through a piece of woods for nearly a mile.

'If I'm not back in an hour, call the neighbors and start them after me. June is a bad month to get buried in the snow, especially when it gets to be so near the month of July.'

'The wind during June, July and August of 1816 was continuously from the north, and it blew fiercely and cold. Farmers wore heavy overcoats and mittens while about their work every day during those months.

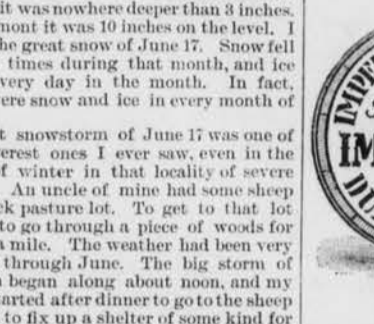
'There was very little rain during the entire season. The great piles of firewood that always accumulated during the summer months at the farmhouse back doors in readiness for winter didn't accumulate in 1816. They were needed for current use.
