According to the present deductions Mr. Seward finds that if the anthracite coal production of the United States should not exceed 60,000,000 tons per annum there is sufficient to last at this average rate for about one hundred years. Speculation, he admits, upon a subject of this kind cannot fail to be more or less misleading.

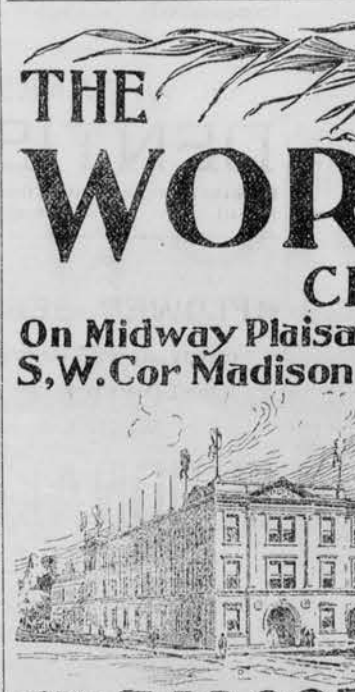
