Rufus B. Ferris Had Said That He Wished to Die Suddenly.

PASSED AWAY WHILE TALKING TO A FRIEND.

Was Sitting in His Chair in His Grandson's House—Work of the Circuit Court.

SWIFT AND PAINLESS END.

Rufus B. Ferris died at the home of his grandson, M. E. Asire, at noon yesterday, in the eighty-fifth year of his age.

The old gentleman had been quite ill for several weeks and in fact his death had been hourly expected.

Shortly before noon Mr. J. Van Iderstine, an intimate friend and frequent companion of Mr. Ferris in many hunting and fishing expeditions, called to see him.

The two old men chatted together a while when suddenly Mr. Ferris dropped back his head and gasped once or twice. Mr. Van Iderstine at once summoned assistance but the end had come and Rufus B. Ferris had died as he often expressed his wish to die—suddenly and without suffering.

Rufus B. Ferris was born at Ferrisburg, Vermont, in 1810 and removed to Oshkosh, Wis., in 1865.

He came to Marquette in 1881 and was known by many people here. He is survived by two children, David R. Ferris and Mrs. H. J. Stevens, the latter being Mr. Asire's mother.
