DEATH HAS CLAIMED HIM.

James Dwyer Passed from Earth Yesterday Morning at 9:30.

TOMORROW'S SERVICES IN MARQUETTE CHURCHES.

Christmas Entertainment at St. Peter's Poultry Club Officers—Dance for New Year's Eve.

FUNERAL TOMORROW AFTERNOON.

After a long and gallant fight against the encroachments of a fatal disease, James Dwyer breathed his last at 9:30 o'clock yesterday morning in a private ward at St. Mary's hospital.

Surgical aid was summoned and a case of thrombosis was discovered, a clot of blood having stopped the circulation in the artery leading to the foot.

Mr. Dwyer was brave and cheerful to the very last day of consciousness but gradually the disease affected the brain, his senses failed him and for the last three days he was quietly sinking into that sleep which knows no awakening in this world.

Mr. Dwyer was about fifty-five years of age and was born in Limerick, Ireland, coming to the United States with his parents, William and Catherine Dwyer, when about ten years of age.

After the death of the father James and the rest of the family removed to Marquette not long before the great fire in May, 1858. He purchased the Lake Superior hotel on Superior street and finally, in 1875, associating his brother with him under the name of Dwyer Brothers, established the wholesale liquor business still conducted by that firm.

Mr. Dwyer in his younger days did considerable exploring throughout the upper peninsula and located a great deal of land with his brother, controlling over 60,000 acres at the time of his death.

The funeral will take place on Sunday afternoon, starting from the residence on Hewitt avenue at 1:30 o'clock. A short service will be held at St. Peter's cathedral and then the remains will be borne to the old Catholic cemetery to be interred by the side of his mother.
