MEXICO'S DOUBLE VOLCANO.

Situated at Colima and Now Once More in Active Eruption. The state of Colima lies on the Pacific coast of the republic, due west of the capital, and is only about the size of Connecticut.

At 6 o'clock on the morning of August 11, 1891, the volcano again began to show signs of eruption, and after a time the whole city of Colima became covered with ash.

The periodically occurring ejections or eruptions of these two craters (every four to eight hours) consist of white aqueous vapors (slightly sulphurous), which rise balloon-shaped, often to an enormous height, where they vertically upward working force is overcome by the wind, and they are driven away as flat clouds, or hover for a long time as thick cloudy masses over the top of the volcano.
