

MORE MEN FOR THE NAVY.

The Enlistment of One Thousand Is Authorized by a Bill Passed Yesterday.

PRESIDENT ALSO GIVEN POWER IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

To Call Out Naval Militia and to Charter Troops Transport Ships—Senator Call Wants Spain Called to Time.

THE DOINGS IN THE SENATE.

WASHINGTON, March 2.—A bill passed by the senate today for an increase in the navy attracted considerable attention in view of the tension of the Spanish-Cuban affairs.

The bill as passed authorizes the addition of one thousand enlisted men to the navy, existing for not more than two years; the calling out of the naval militia forces in case of emergency, and the chartering of transportships in case of emergency.

TURNER OPPOSES RESOLUTIONS. Sulzer (Dem. N. Y.) spoke in favor of the resolution and Turner (Dem. Ga.) followed him in opposition.

The Lighting Commission's Request for More Funds Laid on the Table.

MATTI SALAM CONVICTED IN CIRCUIT COURT OF LARCENY.

Plans Being Prepared by Marquette Architects for Two New Hospital Buildings at Newberry.

WORK OF THE CITY FATHERS.

The council devoted the greater part of its session last night to a discussion of a communication from the electric light commission, requesting that it be authorized to purchase new machinery for the lighting station at a cost not to exceed \$9,000.

The first matter to come before the council was a petition from the Lake Superior & Ishpeming, requesting the use of an alley through blocks 23 to 30, inclusive, in Island Beech addition, also the use of certain streets in that addition.

The monthly bills were allowed as audited by Controller Bay, with the exception of one bill of \$11.25 for insurance premiums which was referred to the finance committee.

At this point the lighting question came up, City Attorney Brown reporting that the charter gives the lighting commission absolute power as to the disposition of poles and lights, consequently the council had no power to order the removal of the arc light from Fourth and Spring to Third and Spring, which it had attempted to do at a previous meeting.

Alderman Tobin contending that the council had a right to place lights where it pleased, the matter of the removal of the light in question was referred to the street committee, with instructions to make an amicable settlement with the lighting commission.

This subject had just been disposed of when the members of the electric light and power commission filed into the council chamber, and shortly afterward Commissioner Pendell announced that, in order to complete the improvements begun at the electric light station, considerable new machinery was needed, which might cost \$9,000.

He asked that the commission be given authority to purchase the machinery at a cost not exceeding the sum stated. By request of Commissioner Pendell, J. C. Murphy of Chicago, a representative of the Fort Wayne (Ind.) electric corporation, was invited to address the council in reference to the Marquette water power.

Mr. Murphy said that he had never seen anything like the water power here, which he thought the largest in the western states and probably in the country. "I think the time will come," said Mr. Murphy, "when the city will be thankful for what has been done in developing its water power."

W. K. Wheeler of the General Electric company also spoke in the highest terms of the power. A discussion followed which at times became somewhat heated.

Alderman Tobin, Rosster and Holley, opposed the proposition to expend \$9,000 at this time. They preferred to leave the question to the incoming council, while Alderman Blanchard and Hoag wanted to settle it at once.
