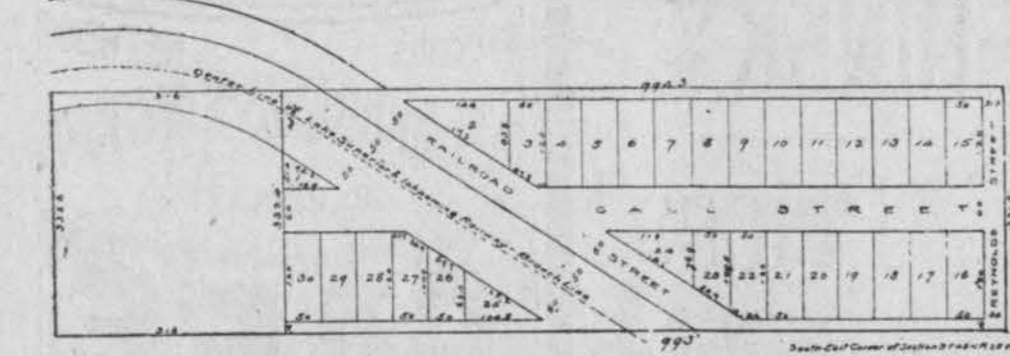

WERE WASHED SHORE. A Boating Party on Teal Lake Has a Slightly Exciting Experience. A party of Ishpeming people, made up of Fred Braastad, John W. Joachim and Fred P. THE COOK. A dish of water placed in a hot oven where pies, cakes or puddings are being baked will prevent them from scorching. When boiling a ham see that "the kettle only smiles on one side of its mouth"—i. e., that the water merely simmers. Aluminum kitchen utensils promise to be in increased demand. They are so pretty, so light and so easy to keep clean, and they only cost enough more than other kinds to make them fashionable. Complete kitchen outfits, from coffee pot to frying pan, are now manufactured. At canning time the filling of jars may be greatly expedited by the use of a grocer's funnel, and a small milk dipper is the best thing for ladling out the hot fruit or syrup. Never use a rubber the second season if possible to procure new ones. When old ones must be employed, drop them to soak a few minutes in boiling water previous to using. Set the jars as soon as contents are cold in a cool and dark place.

Marseilles has just completed its drainage system, on the model of that of Paris, at a cost of 32,000,000 francs. 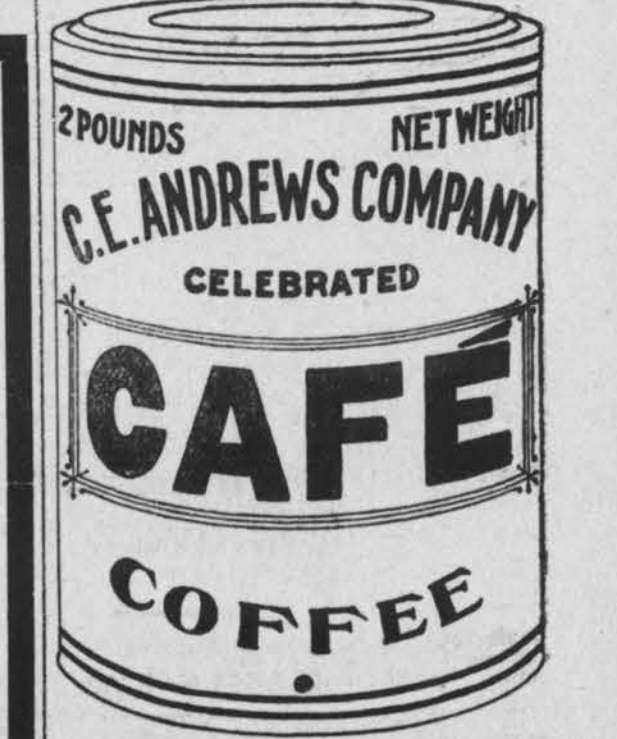
