TRAILS IN THE FOREST.

The Study of Signs Left by Wild Birds and Beasts. The traces which wild birds and mammals leave in the woods, to be found by hunters or washed away by wind or rain, form one of the most interesting studies for those who follow the doings of nature for fun or profit.

Animals in a normal state of mind leave trails that indicate their doings as plainly as any tale written by a naturalist. The hunter or student who follows an Adirondack bear's track sees more than he could read in books.

On the road leading from Northwood to North Lake, northern Herkimer county, a few days ago Elmer Hanlin jumped out of the buckboard on which he was riding and examined an odd-appearing spot in the middle of the road.

Birds, especially ruffed grouse or partridges, are fond of "dusting" in the dry spots where trees have been uprooted, exposing sand or mould to the sun or in the roads and trails.
