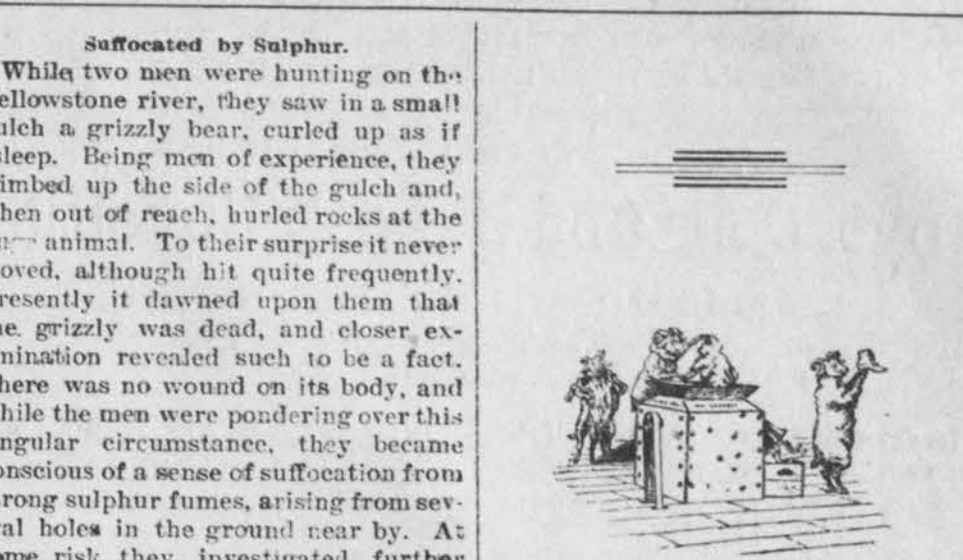
John O'Neill has moved his barber shop from rooms under the Wilkinson bank to the new building across from Mack & Pol's. He has repaired it and fitted it up.

LECTURE BY DR. HEDLEY.

Popular Lyceum Orator Delivers His Address, "The Sunny Side of Life."

WIT, NOT HUMOR, IS THE AMERICAN TRAIT.

Lady Editors at Work-Maccabee Ball New Year's Eve-Quick Decision in a Cow Case-L. O. T. M. Elects Officers.

SECOND NUMBER IN THE COURSE.

Dr. James Hedley, the popular lecturer, furnished the second entertainment in the course being given under the auspices of the Young Men's Sunday Evening club of the Presbyterian church, appearing there last evening and speaking on the theme, "The Sunny Side of Life."

The church was well filled, though not crowded, as was the case with the first attraction. This was probably due to the storm which had a tendency to keep all except course ticket holders away.

The doctor does not aspire to the title of a wit. He would prefer rather to be styled a humorist, which according to his own expression, is a gentler form of the art of good cheer and amusement. With his lecture he mixed a good deal of preaching, but his dogmas were so sugar coated with comicallities that they slipped down easily and it did not seem to occur to the audience that they were sitting under an inculcator of moral truths.

Optimism of the most pronounced sort is his. Happiness is in us, of us, not about us, he says, and consequently not to be found in change of climate or environment. It would be much more common if we were better satisfied with the things we have, instead of coveting the things we have not. He likened people looking in one place and another for happiness to the old woman who was looking for her spectacles, when all the time they were on her forehead. Everything depends on our nature, says he. The needful helps to happiness are very few. There is a silver lining to every cloud, but it must be looked for.

"I like," he says, "the spirit of the chap who, when he pawed his coat to get a loaf of bread and a dog came along and snatched it away," said, "Thank Heaven I still have my appetite!" There is happiness in trouble if you will only fish it out.

Laughter of the kind that's honest, right and pure he calls God's guardian against insanity. Men who do not laugh are always sad, frequently bad and sometimes mad.

Between wit and humor, as he defines them, there is a wide gulf, but they are apt to be confounded one with the other. Wit comes out of the head, and it is always cold. It does not keep love long. That is the trouble with the American people. They are wits, not humorists. Humor is from the heart, something lovable, and its fun does not carry a sting.

Cleanliness and christianity he calls twin sisters. "I never knew," he declares, "a good Christian who could wear the same shirt four Sundays running. The greatest thing in the Y. M. C. A. work, as it strikes me, is its bath."

In his optimism he believes the world is a grand old place to live in. He loves nature in all its many manifestations and forms. "When God finished the world," he said, "he looked on it with a smile on his eternal face and said, 'It is good.' You and I ought to be satisfied with it."

Dr. Hedley is an actor as well as a lecturer, and his facial expression and gestures add greatly to the rich humor of his words. This was particularly true in his characterizations. His description of the courtship of the big gaunt Texan and the rancher's daughter brought ringing deals of laughter from all parts of the house, but much of the humor was in the action which accompanied it. His versatility was put to the test when he took the parts of both wooer and the wooed, and as the suitor caught the fly of his dog's nose to relieve his intense excitement and mental agony, and as the girl coyly sewed away on the Rose of Sharon quilt.

He believes in fashion and art for those who can afford them morally and financially, but he loathes the hypocrisy of so called "society" that he finds in the palaces of sham. "It is possible for more sunshine to find its way into a hut than into such as these," he declared.

In closing he emphasized his opening statement that happiness was from within, not from without.

Last Jury Case.

Yesterday afternoon in the circuit court a verdict was brought in in the last case to be tried by a jury this term. The case was one appealed from a justice court and concerned a cow on which the lower court had set a value of \$60.

The contestants in the case were Charles Upstrom and Carl Hansen. Upstrom had a cow for which he engaged pasturage with Hanson for \$2 a month. The understanding was that he should turn his cow out of the barn at the same time the Hansen cows were turned out, and that the Hansen children would drive them to pasture and bring them back at night. As the children were small and the father was afraid they might get hooked they were not to go into the barn and unloose the Upstrom cow. They were taken sick, and there was no one to drive the cows to pasture, but Upstrom did not notice this and turned his animal out just the same.

She wandered off and was finally found by the joint efforts of Hansen and Upstrom down in Chocology, where a farmer had her waiting for her owner. He also had a feed bill. This bill was the cause of a suit in a justice court brought up by Upstrom to recover the value of his cow. Hansen had no lawyer and the suit went against him. He was not satisfied, and took an appeal to the circuit court, where a jury

decided after two minutes absence from the room that the decision should be reversed.

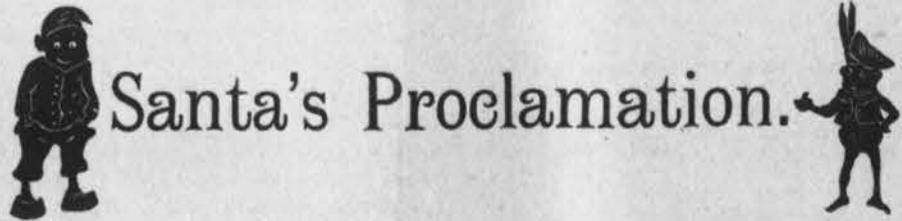
