too large for the present, and if meant for the future are at least four years ahead of time, allowing that copper does not go below 12 cents meanwhile.

"The false figuring on Osceola embraces a declaration that the maximum capacity per stamp has been increased by a recent invention from 300 to 500 tons per day; and it is said that this invention is applicable to jiggings."

NEW MINERAL SOURCES OPENED. As before stated, it is generally conceded that the Osceola is producing 700 tons of copper a month, at least, and it is easy to figure that this equals more than 14,000,000 pounds, ingot, per annum.

"The Osceola is not making 4 cents a pound on its copper, nor is it producing at the rate of even 15,000,000 pounds per annum. If the copper market should remain as high as 12 cents for a few years, there may come a time when Osceola will be producing copper at a net profit of 4 cents per pound, and upon 15,000,000 pounds, but at present 3 cents a pound profit, and \$3 per annum dividend, is nearer the truth than 4 cents per pound profit, and above \$4 per share dividend or earnings."

"By the addition of the Tamarack, Jr., and Kearsarge, the richness of the Osceola has been increased 20 per cent, and a year hence the present stamp mill of six heads will be reinforced by three new and larger stamps. The plans of the management for increased production will be consummated in about four years, and estimates which have appeared at the Lake and in Boston of \$500,000 per annum for Osceola are more than twice
