WELCOME TO THE FIREMEN.

The fifth annual tournament of the Upper Peninsula Firemen's association opens here today, and for this and the two following days the city will be filled with members of the finest body of fire fighters in the northwest.

The association is composed of a gallant lot of men, and has done a grand work since its organization in building up among the departments belonging to it a fraternal feeling, as well as in raising the standard of efficiency in the service which they render.

Again we say to the visiting firemen and their friends, you are welcome, heartily welcome, to Marquette. Make the city yours while you are here, and if our people can feel that you are having a good time they will be amply repaid for all they can do to entertain you.

A BRIBER BROUGHT TO BAY.

Our readers have not forgotten the many sensations connected with the election of Wm. A. Clark by the legislature of Montana last year. While the election was pending it was repeatedly charged that Clark was using money lavishly to corrupt the legislature.

It was the most shameful instance of political bribery that has yet developed in the election of a senator of the United States. Clark was the Democratic candidate, but with all his wealth he was unable to command the support of enough Democratic votes.

An interesting sequel to that election is now developing. The supreme court of Montana has just ruled that one of Clark's agents in the infamous work of debauching the legislature which elected him, a lawyer of Butte named Welcome, must plead in an action for his disbarment on account of the work that he did in bribing members of that body in Clark's interest.

One shipment by lake up to the first of this month were 800,000 tons ahead of the shipments at the corresponding date last year, and are the heaviest on record for the first half of the shipping season to date, being 7,639,706 tons. This is

close to half the highest estimate of the season's shipments, but it is doubtful if the movement of ore for the remainder of the season will be as heavy as it has been thus far. The stockpiles at the mines are pretty well exhausted and the bulk of the shipments hereafter will have to be direct from the shafts as the ore is hoisted. This will tend to curtail the volume of shipments from now on.

The negro vote is one factor in the Kentucky political situation that is more threatening to the Republican gubernatorial candidate than is the anti-Goebel defection to the Democratic nominee. A law providing for "Jim Crow" cars was approved by Governor Bradley. Goebel, who was a member of the state senate, spoke and voted against the bill.

The recent utterances of Senator Burrows relative to the situation in the Philippines has set everybody guessing as to his motive in expressing himself as he did. He is not given credit for patriotic sincerity in the matter, for he is known to be a man sadly lacking in that.

Bryan was at Marinette the other day and addressed an assemblage of 10,000 persons at the Chataqua grounds there. The mill owners gave their men a day off and free tickets so that they might hear him. Ike Stephenson is said to have purchased 2,000 tickets which he distributed among his employees and others.

PARK AND CEMETERY COMMISSION PROCEEDINGS.

The regular monthly meeting of the Park and Cemetery commission was held at its office in the City Hall at 2 o'clock p. m. Present, Hon. Peter White, William F. Fitch and the mayor, Joseph F. Neidhart.

The secretary being absent, on motion of Mr. Fitch Richard Blake was appointed secretary pro tem. The minutes of the last meeting were read, and there being no objections the same were approved.

The president reported that he had collected and turned in to the city treasury the sum of \$242.50; the same being for the rent of pavilion at the island \$12.50, and for lots sold and work done in the cemetery \$230.00.

The secretary reported that the city council had, at its usual meeting in May, allowed this commission the sum of \$3,500, being the full amount asked in its annual estimate of funds needed for the year, and that said council, at its meeting on June 8th, transferred for present use to the credit of this commission the sum of \$600, and at its meeting on July 3rd the further sum of \$1,400.
