In and About Negaunee.

FINE AUTUMN WEATHER. BUT IT COMES A WEEK TOO LATE TO HELP OUT THE MARQUETTE COUNTY FAIR.

The weather of the past few days has been the finest that has been experienced here in considerably over a month. It could not be bettered. Negaunee people are taking advantage of it to get outside work done in preparation for the winter, and all is bustle about the city.

It is hoped that the pleasant spell will continue but it is too good to last long. It may hold fine for a week or more, but after that it will be time to look out for squalls. Many parties are spending the days in the woods this week, and several hunting trips are being arranged for the end of the week.

FRANK COTTEN, who has been employed with Winter & Sues for some time, was summoned to Chicago Tuesday by a telegram informing him of the death of his sister-in-law and her young son, also a man who boarded with her, by asphyxiation Monday night. No details were given in the message he received, but the Chicago News of Tuesday supplies these particulars:

"Mrs. Jungels, who was a widow thirty-five years old, lived at the number given with her fourteen-year-old son. The father was a switchman employed by the Santa Fe railroad and boarded with them. When the bodies were found by the police the rooms were filled with gas, which was escaping from two open valves in the gas stove. Mrs. Jungels had lived in the neighborhood but a short time, having come to the city from Aurora."

LOWER MICHIGAN FRUIT. Merchants here have been surprised this week by the arrival of two carloads of fruit from lower Michigan. The fruit trade has heretofore been looked after from Illinois and Wisconsin points, and lower Michigan dealers had had only a small portion of it. It would seem as if this is about to be changed. Two Grand Rapids firms have had cars here this week dealing with the local trade. Maynard & Reed had a load here Tuesday and a representative of W. K. Munson was here yesterday with a car. Our merchants are pleased to see the lower peninsula men here, as Michigan fruit is of fine quality. Shippers from lower Michigan have to contend with more expensive freights than those who are situated advantageously on the roads running to Chicago, but if they see their way clear to bring fruit to the peninsula they will have no difficulty in disposing of it.

COUNCIL MEETS TONIGHT. The regular October meeting of the common council will be held this evening. There is considerable interest in the session as it will take further action in the case of ex-Recorder Johnson. George A. MacDonald will report on his findings of discrepancies in the books, and the council will take steps to have the bondsmen reimburse the city.
