The excellent Boer marksmanship, combined with the fact that it is an unwritten rule in the British army that officers must always stand under fire even though the men are lying down, makes mourning probable in many a noble British house.

PLANS OF THE ADMIRALTY. The admiralty is, perhaps, more on trial than the army, especially as it is well known that General Lord Garnet Wolseley, commander-in-chief, does not approve a system which gives the navy such far-reaching power in transporting troops.

WAR EFFECTING DIAMONDS. PRICES SOAR UPWARD ON THE TRANSVAAL TROUBLE, WITH A STEADY RISE IN SIGHT. New York, Oct. 15.-Diamonds are scarcer and more valuable today than they have been at any time since the great diamond mines were discovered in South Africa.

TRUST OWNS THE MINES. Boston, Oct. 15.-The cause of the advance of 50 per cent in the past year in the price of the precious stones is viewed differently in jewellers' circles here, some claiming that in the mines there is a scarcity of fine diamonds, which will continue for several years.

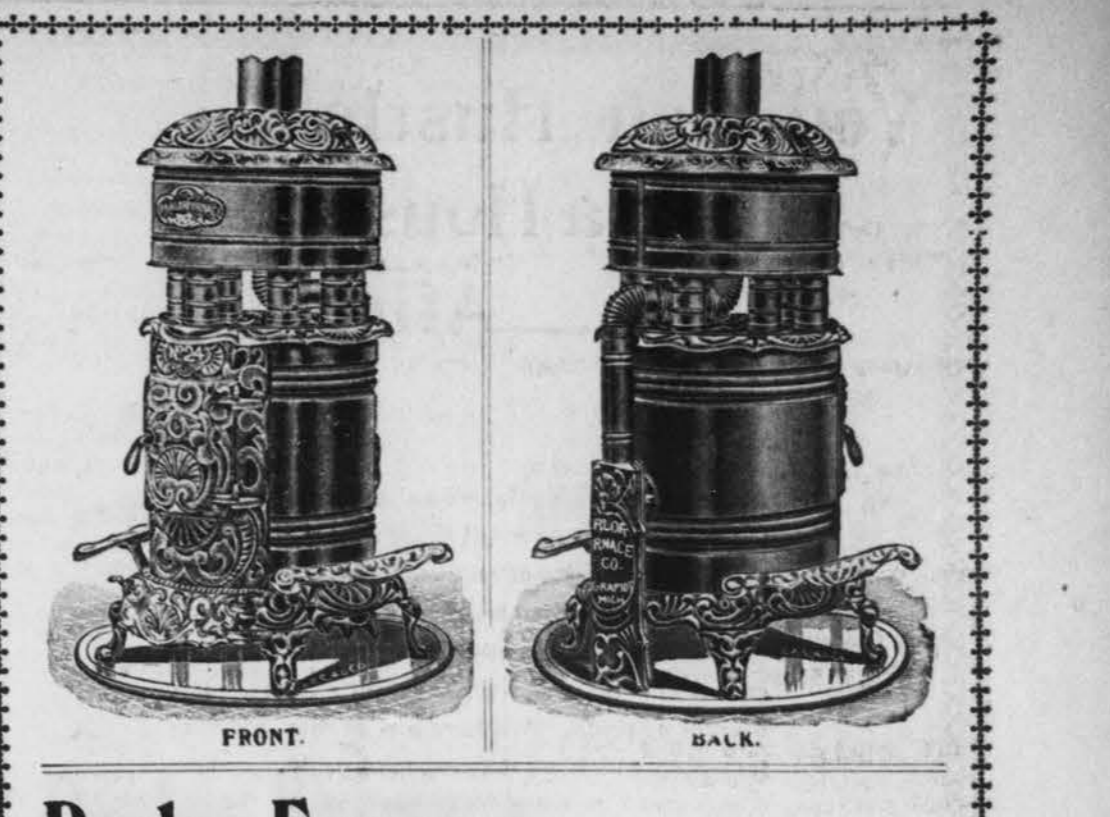

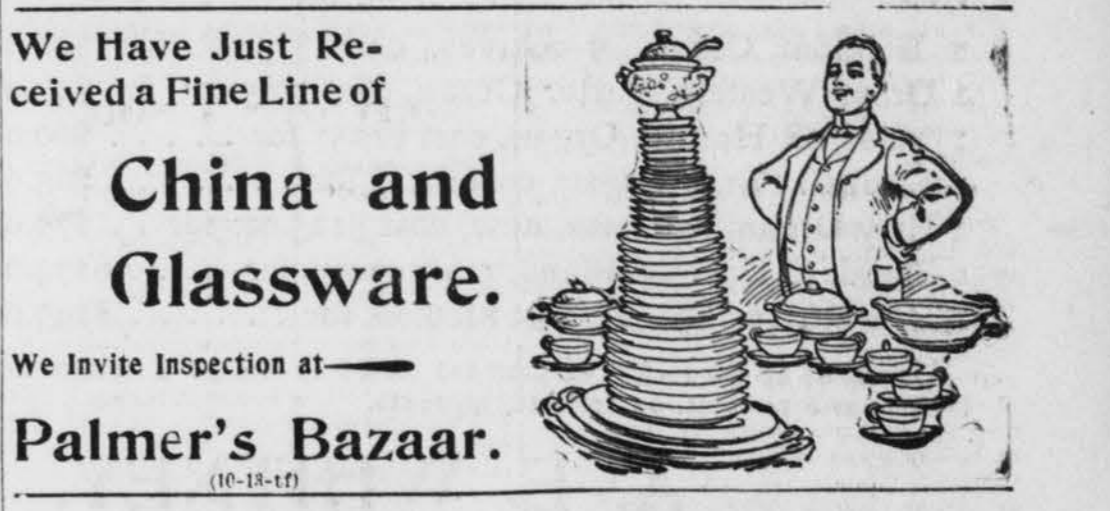
