"We have returned to the days of Galileo, or a little after his time, when astronomers used to build enormous telescopes one hundred feet or so in length," said Secretary S. P. Langley of the Smithsonian Institution.

The apparatus referred to by Mr. Langley is indeed a wonderful affair, looking in its immensity, when seen from a little distance, somewhat like the side-show of a circus.

"This is a telescope reduced to the simplest possible form," continued Mr. Langley, "having only a single lens and a tube. The place of the observer's eye is taken by the photographic plate, of course. We expect to get some very interesting results, but you must realize that many difficulties are involved."

"It will be practicable, he should set up the camera-telescope in such a way as to point it up in the air directly at the sun, but the apparatus is too large, and we are obliged on that account to rest the whole of its length upon the ground, using a mirror to reflect the image of the solar orb into the mouth of the instrument."

"Obviously," the photograph of the spectrum does not show the colors, because we do not know yet how to make color photographs, but it does exhibit the secular lines which are now known to represent various elements of which the sun is composed, such as hydrogen and different metals, all of the latter in a gaseous condition.

NAVIGATION HELPS OUT.

Opening of the Shipping Season Causes Export Business to Increase in Volume.

SHIPMENTS HELD BACK FOR OPENING OF NAVIGATION.

April Exports Run Far Above Those of March—Exports so Far in May More Than Double April—Imports Show a Marked Falling Off.

BOATS GIVE FOREIGN TRADE A BOOST.

Open navigation furnishes the people of the northwest with a cheap means of transportation of their surplus products to foreign markets. That they avail themselves of this opportunity is made manifest by the great increase in the volume of exports as soon as the boats begin to run. The variation in imports is comparatively small, and as the leading import into this section of the country is wood pulp, the total is apt to be larger in the winter months than in summer.

The April report of exports and imports which has just been made up in the office of Collector Adams, shows a surprising increase in export business over the month of March, and that when April had but seven or eight days of open navigation. In March the exports were at a low ebb. The effect of open navigation on the business is more strikingly shown by the fact that so far this month the total exports amount to more than double the exports for the entire month of April.

FOOD STUFFS' BIG SHOWING.

Exports from the district of Superior in the month of April totalled \$25,025, against \$48,379 in March and \$68,443 in April 1899. The commodities in which the increase is shown principally are wheat and wheat flour.

During the month the exports of wheat amounted to 253,901 bushels valued at \$179,961. England took it all. Wheat flour was exported to the amount of 18,294 barrels valued at \$51,194. This was divided between England and the province of Quebec, the former taking 16,611 barrels valued at \$55,594, and the latter 1,683 barrels valued at \$5,600. Four hundred and ninety-five barrels of cement were exported, a value being set on the total of \$1,002.

The exports of iron and the manufactured products from that metal constitute a considerable factor in the monthly export list. Of pig iron there was 119 tons valued at \$2,350. The manufactured iron exported totalled \$2,947. Machinery went in at \$10,036.

Navigation being open the Soo got only a small part of the business instead of all of it as it does during the winter months when all exports must go by rail. Last month the business was handled through three ports, Sault Ste. Marie, Gladstone and West Superior. Sault Ste. Marie got \$25,142; Gladstone, \$61,194; and West Superior \$179,961. The bulk of the export busi-

ness was handled in American steamers, which are credited with \$240,980. There were no foreign vessels in the trade. Cars handled \$24,718.

IMPORTS GROW LESS.

All imports, both free and dutiable, totalled but \$34,086, against \$35,391 of the month before and \$14,719 for April 1899. The total free exports amounted to \$9,093; the total dutiable to \$14,993.

The big item in the free list was as usual household furniture, only last month it was larger than usual, \$5,903. The only other item on the free list running over a thousand dollars was eighteen head of cattle listed at \$2,450. Under dutiable imports there were entered 561 head of cattle valued at \$6,844. Manufactured iron came in under this head to the value of \$1,476. Wood pulp was imported to the amount of 411 tons and to the value of \$6,126. All the import business was handled via Sault Ste. Marie and nearly all of it in cars. Imports by rail amounted to \$23,596; by American steamers, \$490.

TALKING ABOUT A VAULT.

Park Board Considering Building One in Park Cemetery.

The Park and Cemetery commission has now under consideration the advisability of building a receiving vault in Park cemetery, though it has taken no definite action looking to the erection of such a structure. Need has been found for a vault a number of times, and as the city increases in size such need is bound to become more pressing and frequent. With a public vault in the cemetery it would be possible at any time to keep bodies when it was not convenient or desirable to have the interment immediately.

In the past few years the board has put Presque Isle in pretty good shape and the probabilities are that not much work will be done there this season. If anything is done the foot path will be extended past the animal cages to the watering place on the side of the hill.

POLITICIANS' CHUCKLE.

Coup the Antis Sprung Monday Night Causes a Laugh.

There was a good deal of quiet laughter yesterday among those who are more or less interested in local politics over the fate of the police committee's recommendations, when its two nominees for the police force were turned down and in their place two other men favored by the anti-administration crowd were given jobs.

Those who had a hand in the coup are laughing with the greatest delight, but even those against whom the action was directed, also laugh occasionally. The trick was so neatly turned that it was funny.

Under all ordinary conditions the council has a good working majority on the side of the administration, but a bad rainy night kept the majority of the mayor's supporters at home while those who are against the administration didn't mind water at all and were out in force.

The result was that what is naturally a minority proved to be a majority and a very effective one at that, for it took

the first chance that has been offered it and put its little deal right through. The disaffection of the Swedes through Lindholm's turn-down changes the balance of the council slightly. Alderman Ekstrom is now avowedly anti-administration. This makes the division nine to seven in favor of the mayor instead of ten to six as it was before.

The next place where the two factions will do battle is over the plat for the Normal Bluff addition. This will probably come up at the next meeting or so. The plat which was submitted by the owner, J. M. Longyear, was not approved by the street committee and the council once voted to reject it. The street committee had another plat, but that was not approved by Mr. Longyear.

Now that the complexion of the council is somewhat changed the Longyear plat will be offered again. It will be generally supported by the anti crowd and it is claimed enough votes can be secured among the administration faction to get it through. This, however, is denied by those who oppose the plat.
