The Chinese themselves do not protest because. as the members of Li Hung Chang's staff put it, their objections would be useless, as whatever they say or do in the way of protest only elicites uncivil treatment.

The observatory is universally recognized as one of the most interesting sights in Pekin. Most of the instruments now out of place are over a hundred and fifty years old. Many are magnificent bronzes and, although not of modern type, can still be used for the purpose of astronomical observation.
