(ADDITIONAL.) BUSY YEAR FOR CUPID. MARRIAGE LICENSES ISSUED THE PAST TWELVE MONTHS 100 MORE THAN THE 1899 RECORD.

The county clerk's office reports a considerable increase in the number of marriage licenses that have been issued to date in comparison to that of last year at the same time. So far 759 certificates have been given out and the principals of these are numbered among the residents of every corner of the county as well as strangers from this state and of neighboring states.

ROAD ACROSS THE LAKE. COPPER RANGE NOW BUILDING IT FOR BENEFIT OF PATRONS.

The Copper Range railroad yesterday started to build its road across the ice from Houghton to Hancock. The ice is now thick enough for the thoroughfare and deemed perfectly safe for teams to travel over.

Each of the approaches to the lake will be made of logs and constructed in such a manner that no difficulty will be had with the hauling of heavy loads over them. The road at Hancock will be at the foot of the street leading down to Close & Bawden's office and the one in Houghton will be near the freight depot.

Only three train crews out of the six that have been in commission now remain on the Copper Range road. The crews making up the Hancock crew will be engaged in construction work, and the majority of them are being reemployed by the company for other work.

ARRANGEMENTS are being made by the Copper Range officials to put another train on the new branch extending to the Baltic, Trimountain and Champion mines. That will give double service which will be greatly appreciated by patrons using the road.
