A NARROW ESCAPE.

In the winter of 1902, I resided for a few months in Amoy, one of the five principal cities of foreign trade in China, and there, as usual, occurred to me an idea about to write. THE GOVERNMENT AND THE TELEGRAPH.

Congress is again called to consider the question of taking the telegraph business of the country under the management of the government, and incorporating it with the postal service. The most careful and plausible arguments in favor of the subject have been reported in the Senate, and will soon be the topic of discussion in their respective houses as ever, and the bill is likely to pass.

It is plain on the one hand that telegraph is a social convenience, an educator, a power in civilization, yet in its history in the country where it has been introduced, it has often been a source of exasperation, and as a result the wires are not protected by the law.

The value of the telegraph does not consist in the amount of time which it saves by its use, but in the fact that it has practically annihilated the distance between the sender and the receiver. A telegraph message occupies two days in going from New York to London, and yet reaches the other end in a matter of hours.
