The Manchester Examiner, speaking of the effect upon shipping caused by the great rise in price and the scarcity of coal, says the number of steamers loading in Liverpool for distant ports has decreased very considerably, there being at present none on the berth for Australia, and only two for China and the East. During the last two months the coal used on board steamers has gone up 15s, per ton, and as large vessels consume upon the the lowest computation sixty tons per day, there is thus a daily increase in the cost, too, is not all that steamship owners complain of, for it is in very many cases found impossible to obtain enough coal for their requirements, even at these enormous rates. The only class who profit by these rises in the price of coal are the sailing-ship owners, the demand for sailing vessels being, of course, much greater than formerly. By the latest reports from Bombay the freight for cotton from that port to Liverpool by steamer was 45s, per ton, to which must be added 16s, for the Sucz Canal dues, while the freight by sailing ship was 40s, the difference being thus considerably in favor of the sailing.






