GETTING SCARED. Canadian Lumbermen Claiming for as-sets port duty on Logs to Prevent American Mills from Handling on Canadian Timber.

Canadian Manufacturer: The demolition of our timber limits for the benefit of American saw mill owners is a question that has not yet received the attention it deserves, mainly on account of the supineness of the Canadian lumbermen who are most directly interested.

At the late meeting of the Michigan state grange, the project of forming a union between the granger element and the labor organizations of the state was considered. It met with approval, and a committee of three was appointed to confer with a similar committee representing the labor organizations of Michigan.

Such a combination would not be without its incongruities. The labor organizations have been formed to protect workmen against the rapacity of the employer class. Now, the grangers are nearly all employers, and the hardest worked and most poorly paid employes in the country are their "hired help."

The granger's grievance is quite distinct from that of the laboring man. His is against the monopolists and railroads, who charge him too much for what he has to buy, or levy excessive tariff on what he has to transport to market.

Our news dispatches the other day gave the gist of the ruling made by secretary Lamar, of the interior department, in the land cases of John B. Weimer, Patrick D. Murphy and Nicholas Kirst.

There seems to be no valid reason why South Dakota should not be admitted to the sisterhood of states, unless the increased strength in congress that the republicans would thereby obtain can be so regarded, which is a preposterous assumption.
