THEY ARE GOOD MEN.

Body of Thomas Nichols, Buried at the Cleveland Lake, Not Yet Recovered.

Though quite a force of men has been working since the time of the accident at the Cleveland Lake mine, the remains of Thomas Nichols have not been found. Opinions vary as to the length of time it will take to reach his body, but to quote Captain Collick there is really nothing certain in the matter. No one knows just where the body lies and therefore it has been necessary to drift in two directions. As was mentioned in yesterday's issue of The Mining Journal, Nichols' remains may lie in either one of several places. They may be in the ladderway, the chute or on the third level. The cave extended from the surface to the bottom of the mine, or the third level, and the hole on surface is perhaps one hundred feet square. This was in no sense the worst cave in which has occurred at the Lake, but it is the first which has caught a miner. It came unexpectedly, being in a section of the mine which has always been regarded as safe. As is the custom the men were summoned out before a stop was wasted in. This stop was one of large dimension, it being fifteen by twenty-four feet, but it did not come down. After waiting a short time the four gangs returned to work. It was but a short time after that the ground commenced to come in. All the men but Nichols and Maddock had the difficulty in getting away, but they were not so fortunate. Just why it is not apparent, for the cave was fifty feet south of them. Nichols was twenty feet ahead of his partner in their mad rush for safety, but in turning a sharp corner which the drift takes at this point he either tried to go down the ladderway at the turn or fell through the chute. The chute lies beyond the ladderway as he was running, but it is possible that he may have missed the latter opening in his hurry and have fallen through the former hole. Maddock kept on, turned the corner and was soon in a safe place with the other miners. The ground came slowly at first, but soon quickened its pace until it was the question of but a few moments before the ladderway, chute and sub-level were completely filled with the mud. If Nichols found his way down the ladder, the chances are that the mud came too quick for him and that before he had a chance to reach the third level, to which the ladderway leads, it had overtaken and overpowered him. Then there is the chance that he stumbled and fell in the drift without reaching either opening. These are the conditions which lead the captain to be extremely conservative in his statements regarding the time required to locate the remains. Much of the drift has been cleaned out, but there still remains not a little work to be done. The miners are laid off in this part of the property, pending the clearing of this drift and about one hundred feet of another.
