The strike in the steel mills of the United States Steel Corporation had an immediate effect in lowering the market value of its shares. It will have another hurtful effect in cutting off the wages of the men ordered out, who will remain idle for an undetermined interval.

Speaking of the strike ordered by the Amalgamated association, the New England Statist remarks that the association chose its time to make its demands with very good judgment.

As the executive officers of the Amalgamated explain it, the strike is not for an advance in wages, but for a more complete recognition of that organization.

Our belief is that the strike will be of brief duration, as it involves a loss to both the men and their employers so large that both will more earnestly seek a plan of agreement, now that issue has been fairly joined between them.
