TOUGH ON JUNK NEWSPAPERS. In giving effect to the new interpretation of the rule, as to second class mail matter, the postoffice authorities have decided that so-called newspapers and publications which advertise guesses and contests, and offer similar returns of doubtful beneficence to their subscribers, shall be deprived of the privilege of the mails after Oct. 1, unless they cease to insist interest in their columns by catering to people who take a chance on anything.

THE FIXING OF THE DATE OF THE DISCONTINUANCE of such features at Oct. 1 shows that there is a spirit of leniency pervading the postoffice department, and that it is probably based on a charitable disposition toward the more legitimate publications which have been induced by exigent conditions to resort to these means of reestablishing a decadent circulation.
