THE ROPES GOLD MINE.
 Price McKinney Says It Will Be Operated at No Distant Date.

Price McKinney, the well known mining man of Cleveland, O., and Captain George Wallace, who has general supervision of the mining affairs of Corrigan, McKinney & Co. on the several iron ranges of the Lake Superior district, spent an hour in Ishpeming between trains yesterday morning. They came in on the Chicago & Northwestern line and departed later on the same road for Gladstone.

Mr. McKinney was asked by a representative of The Mining Journal what the chances are for an early resumption of operations at the Ropes gold mine. He said that he could not tell just what would be done in the way of mining, but he asserted that operations would be resumed there sooner or later. He said that the treatment of the tailings by the cyanide process is moving along very satisfactorily, and that when this work is finished something will be done with the mine. He expressed the belief that the Ropes can be made a winner, provided the mill and other equipment is thoroughly modern. He said that when work is resumed the cyaniding will be continued. As fast as the tailings leave the mill they will be treated. In this way there will be no waste of the gold.

Captain Robinson, who has been in charge of the mine for some years, informed Mr. McKinney that the property never looked better than when operations ceased there. The quartz coming from the bottom level showed more free gold than any they had ever obtained in the levels above. Both McKinney and Wallace rely a great deal on Captain Robinson's judgment, and they are satisfied that the property will show up all right when operated with improved machinery and on an economic basis. The workings are now about half full of water, but it will not take long to pump them out, once the start is made.

The visitors regretted that they did not have time to go out to the mine and look over the work being done there. The treating of the tailings on the dump will hardly be completed this fall. The Ropes mine is the only property on this range that Corrigan, McKinney & Co. are interested in at this time.

FELL EIGHTY FEET.

John Roberts, pipeman at the Cleveland Lake mine, was injured at that mine yesterday at 1:30 o'clock by a fall which probably will result fatally. He was repairing one of the pipes at a distance of about eighty feet above the level and in some manner or other lost his balance and fell to the ground, striking his head on a rock. He also received several bad scalp wounds and his right side was terribly bruised. The injured man was at once removed to the Ishpeming hospital, where his hurts were attended to. The doctors entertain little hope for his recovery. Roberts is twenty-eight years of age and married, but has no children. His home is on East Ridge street. Later—Mr. Roberts died at 7:30 last night at the Ishpeming hospital. Arrangements for the funeral have not been completed, but it will probably take place Sunday afternoon.
