ORE WILL

System to Be Followed Something Like That in Vogue at the Coal Docks Here and Means Work

for More Mer.

Good progress has been made with the cessories at Presque Isle, where the Cleveland Cliffs company intends to store the outqut of the Cleveland Lake Shaft mine this winter, and it is probable that the new arrangement will go into operation within a short time.

The capacity of the stockpile will be about 350,000 tons. It in itself is really a very simple affair, being, like the stockpiles at the mines, composed of but at 2 o'clock. heavy planks laid flat on the ground. However, with its adjuncts it becomes more elaborate and will serve an important purpose

The stockpile is located just north of the long dock trestle and to the west of the street railway tracks. Underneath the dock trestle is being constructed a pocket similar to the ones ore will be dumped from the cars, the receptacle having a capacity of fifty or sixty tons. From the pocket the ore heavy planking below.

The tram cars will be operated from set forth. an engine house. This structure is practically completed and is located south of the dock trestle and between the boulevard and the street railway tracks. Into this building will be moved the pumping plant which furnishes the water supply and fire protection for the dock, the pump house now being situated at the north side of the dock near the lake shore. 
