Upper Peninsula.

James Stokes, a well known miner residing at Carleton, Alger county, last week shot and killed two black bears. A third bruin got away.

Several racoons have been killed in the vicinity of Manistique recently, and one was captured alive in a warehouse. Coons are scarce animals in the upper peninsula.

Wright Bros. of Iron Mountain have just entered into a contract with the St. Paul road whereby they will cut 300,000 cedar ties for the company this winter.

The Escanaba & Lake Superior road is just completing the construction of a thirteen-mile branch from Northland to near Forsyth, Marquette county.

Considerable excitement and some interruption with the operation of the mine has been caused at the Aragon, at Norway, the past few days because of the claim by several miners who rode up from their work that they saw a ghost going down in the other cage.

A number of superstitious miners employed at the Montreal mine, at Ironwood, have quit during the last few days owing to the fact that one of their fellow employees recently was taken sick while underground and lost his life while returning to surface.

Diphtheria has again broken out at Amasa, and the town is once more quarantined. The schools are closed, and no public gatherings are permitted.

The entire production of the plant since operations were started some months ago is still stored in the yards of the Northwest Lumber company at Escanaba. This comprises over four million staves, the company being determined not to sell until better prices than now attain are offered.

It is said that, owing to the non-arrival of boats, there is a great blockade of ore at the Escanaba docks. The pockets are filled with ore, and in the yards there are over a thousand loaded cars.

In a letter received yesterday from Otto Eibner, whose position was mentioned in yesterday's issue, he informs his folks that he has been given the position of head bookkeeper in Corrigau, McKinney & Co.'s office at Duluth.

A new lamp has just been placed on Jennings street. This large electrical number of lamps in use on the streets of the city to forty-four. Superintendent Gaffney of the lighting plant reports that there are now 1,165 incandescent lamps in use throughout the city.

Charles Larson, brother-in-law of Ernest Hollman, who was murdered a week ago tonight in his saloon at Rhinelander, Wis., returned from the Wisconsin town yesterday morning. He informs Negaunee friends that he will soon go to Rhinelander to take charge of the business. Hollman was conducting at the time of his death.
