THE SEASON'S ORE SHIPMENTS. We take the following article on ore shipments for the season now nearing the close from the Cleveland Plain Dealer:

The much talked of 20,000,000 ton mark in the movement of ore from the Lake Superior district has been passed.

Shipments in November were 1,865,353 tons, making the movement up to Dec. 1, 20,000,926 tons, compared with 18,570,310 tons for the full season of 1900.
