BIG FERRY BOATS NIPPED. Passenger Describes Recent Battle With Ice at the Straits.

W. E. Hampton, editor of the Charlevoix Courier, was a passenger on the Ste. Marie during the big boat's recent experience with the ice at the straits.

The other car-ferry, the St. Ignace, soon arrived on the scene, and from that time until 4 o'clock the next morning there followed eighteen hours of incessant backing and luffing, pushing and pulling.

The St. Marie was finally loosened, and then the St. Ignace went "way back and sat down," so to speak, while the big sister again tackled the ice-floes ahead.

The immediate cause of this unprecedented weight of ice was the shoving of two fields of drift ice together, while the stiff current, augmented by the terrific force of the gale, crowded the fields together until in some places the cakes of ice are piled upon each other below the surface of the water to a depth of twenty-eight feet.

The surface of the ice was so rough that walking was out of the question. A man would have been badly cut up if he had tried to walk ashore, while the freezing gale would have cut him to death if he had by chance slipped through a crack and got wet.
