FORTY THOUSAND PEOPLE PERISHED IN ERUPTION

Magnitude of Disaster at St. Pierre, Martinique, Is Appalling.

CITY TOTALLY DESTROYED BY FLAMES AND LAVA. But Few of the Residents Escaped and Survivors Say Scene Was Like Glimpses of Hades—U. S. Consul Prentiss and Family Thought to Be Among the Victims—Cable Communication Is Cut and Details of Catastrophe Received Are Only Meagre.

St. Thomas, May 9.—9:30 a. m.—The French cruiser Suchet arrived at Pointe-a-Pitre, in the island of Guadeloupe, from Fort De France, this morning bringing several refugees. She confirmed the report that the town of St. Pierre was entirely destroyed at 8 o'clock Thursday morning, by a violent volcanic eruption.

How London Views It. London, May 10.—The newspapers here express the utmost horror for the Martinique catastrophe which, they say, for its suddenness and magnitude is only comparable with that of Pompeii.

French Send Assistance. Paris, May 9.—The colonial minister received this evening a message from the secretary general for the government at Martinique that in view of the reports of the eruption at Mont Pelee which wiped out St. Pierre all the boats available at Fort De France were despatched to the assistance of the inhabitants of that place.

Forty Thousand Perish. It is now estimated that forty thousand persons perished as a result of the volcanic eruption in the island of Martinique.

U. S. Consul a Victim. Washington, May 9.—The state department has received a cablegram from Consul Ayme at Pointe-a-Pitre dated May 9 in which he says that at 7 o'clock in the morning of May 8, a storm of steam and mud and fire enveloped the city and community.

Kingston, Jamaica, May 9.—All the islands in the neighborhood of Martinique are isolated apparently by the earthquake. Cable communication with St. Vincent, Barbados, Grenada, Trinidad and St. Lucia is interrupted.

New York, May 9.—The body of the Most Reverend Michael Corrigan D. D., archbishop of New York was interred today in the crypt of St. Patrick's cathedral.

Chimes played, and then the bells tolled from the spires and after that a thousand priests and bishops and archbishops and Cardinal Gibbons filed in, following the boy with the cross and the candle bearers.

Archbishop Ryan of Philadelphia, preached the sermon. At the conclusion of the service the casket containing the body was placed in a crypt under the high altar and placed in a vault beside the bodies of Archbishop Hughes and Cardinal McCloskey.

Among the archbishops present were Williams of Boston; Feehan of Chicago; Elder of Cincinnati; Ireland of St. Paul; Keane of Dubuque; Chappella of New Orleans; Christie of Oregon; Kain of St. Louis; Franchet of Montreal.
