New York, June 19.—Democratic unity was the keynote tonight of a great gathering of representative Democrats who had come to attend the opening of the Tilden club.

Cleveland's Speech. "I have been urged to participate in this occasion by those who have assured me that this handsome structure is to be dedicated tonight to the rehabilitation and consolidation of the Democratic party."

Longs for Democratic Victories. "The Democratic party is very far from political insolvency; but no one here should be offended by the suggestion that its capital and prospects have suffered serious injury since Mr. Tilden was elected president."

Takes Shot at Trusts. "Democracy has already in store in the doctrines for which it fights its successful battles, and it will have them in store as long as the people are kept from their own, and just as long as their rights and interests are sacrificed."
