FINDS TWO THOUSANDS ACRES OF LAND UNDER THE PLOW.

Orchard Contains 23,000 Trees and Included in the Livestock Is a Herd of 105 Cattle Valued at Close to \$40,000.

FATALITY AT GRAND MARAIS.

Frank J. O'Brien Accidentally Shot There Saturday.

News comes from Grand Marais of a fatal hunting accident near there Saturday. A young man named John S. Chisholm, son of one of the Manistique & Northern railway officials accompanied by Frank J. O'Brien were out in the bush and in some manner Chisholm's gun was discharged, the full charge of buckshot entering O'Brien's back.

Chisholm hastened to Grand Marais for assistance and an engine and tender with a physician was at once despatched to the scene of the accident and several parties drove out in rigs.

The unfortunate young man was about twenty-five years of age and had just graduated from the law department at Ann Arbor. He was visiting his brother at Grand Marais. Chisholm is prostrated with grief over the awful fatality.

REVIEW ORDERED.

Tax Commissioners Will Be in Marquette July 20.

Manville Jenks, member of the state tax commission, was here yesterday arranging for a visit of the commission to Marquette on July 10, when it will review the assessment rolls of the cities of Ishpeming, Negaunee and Marquette, with the purpose of considering the assessed values fixed on the property of three corporations, namely, the L. S. & L. railroad company, the Marquette City and Presque Isle Street Railway company and the Negaunee & Ishpeming Street Railway and Electric Power company.

The portion of the property of the L. S. & L. road to which the commission will give attention is the Presque Isle dock. It is assumed that the members are of the opinion that the assessed valuation is too low and that they will want it raised.

The dock was placed on the rolls this spring by the board of review, and City Assessor Bay's work will not be in question when the commissioners come to town.

The street railway companies will have to show that their present valuations are sufficient, or they will see the figures materially increased. The members will have the rolls at their service and they will be competent to subpoena any witness they may desire to call before them.

CLIMBS THE HILLS.

J. E. Ball's Automobile Has Responded to All Tests to Date.

The Olds gasoline automobile, recently purchased by J. E. Ball and now being operated by that gentleman, has nobly responded to all the tests to which it has been put in the few days it has been in operation here.

The first day that Mr. Ball used the machine he had some difficulty mounting the steep little hill skirting Mr. Long-year's residence at the foot of Ridge street, but he had four people in the vehicle at the time and had not thoroughly mastered the management of the driving gear.

Mr. Ball hopes to be able to use the automobile on the country roads radiating in all directions from the city. A trip out beyond Forestville is contemplated, although it is doubtful if the carriage can make the ascent of the bad hill at the electric power station. The road out by the way of the brewery and Rancourt is practicable, but the Forestville bridge is said to be in bad condition.

Sand is the greatest obstacle to the successful operation of the vehicle. If the road is only hard and firm, it can be taken almost anywhere, but it balks when it gets in soil which simply embeds the wheels.

Mr. Ball is delighted with his experiences as a chauffeur and he expects to get considerable enjoyment out of his machine. He expresses himself as pleased with its workings and hopes to demonstrate its practicability for this country.
