L. S. & I. RIGHT-OF-WAY.
Land Owners Will Fight the Corporation in Condemnation Proceedings.

The railway spur to the Maas mine is not going in as rapidly as expected. The work has been delayed on account of the failure of the owners of land on the right-of-way and the officials of the company to agree on terms.

As announced in the Marquette department of The Mining Journal a few days ago, the Lake Superior & Ishpeming Railway company has commenced condemnation proceedings with a view to forcing the land owners to what they consider equitable terms.

There are four parties, Louis Corbett, Charles Martel, George J. Haupt and the Gauthier estate concerned in the deal. A representative of the company recently offered what he considered an equitable price for the right-of-way, but they refused his terms, in some cases more than double what the corporation was willing to allow being asked.

The Haupt farm is the first the railway will strike; then comes Gauthier's, then Martel's. The tract nearest the mine is Corbett's.

The fight promises to be interesting. Twelve men will be chosen to decide what sum should be paid each land owner. The parties concerned think they are not unreasonable in their demands and their attorney will argue their case for all it is worth.

The proposed right-of-way passes along the front of the greater part of the land in question, between the farms and the highway leading to Marquette. The owners claim that the value of their land will be greatly reduced by their being shut off from the road.

The railway people have a right-of-way through the Cleveland-Cliffs' Iron company's land which might be used, but the route through the farms of the parties mentioned would be the most desirable. Besides it will be through territory in which it will never be necessary to sink shafts, or conduct mining operations.

It is hoped that the matter will be adjusted soon, as all will be pleased if the spur is completed before winter sets in. A delay in building the road might cause a set-back in operations at the Maas mine.

WARRIORS WHO WERE WOMEN.
Many Have Fought Bravely—Escaped of a Queen.

The muster rolls of the civil war show a number of cases of soldiers who were discovered to be women.

One of the most remarkable women warriors, says the Baltimore Sun, was Christian Cavanaugh, who lived in England in the nineteenth century. She was married and had three children. Her husband was carried off to Holland, where he had to enlist as a private soldier. His wife dressed as a man and enlisted so as to be near her husband. She was wounded at the battle of Landen, made a prisoner by the French and carried to St. Germain-en-Yaye, where she remained until she was exchanged. Then she quarreled and fought a duel with her sergeant and was transferred to another regiment. Again she was wounded, at Ramillies, when her secret was discovered. She was, however, permitted to remain with the regiment as a cook.

Many English officers recall the case of Mrs. Lindley, the wife of a soldier, who, through some of the sharpest engagements of the civil war. She enlisted in Company D, Sixth Ohio Cavalry

and fought at Fort Magruder, Hanover Court House, Bull Run, Antietam and Boonboro. She is said to be still living and the mother of several children. Christina, queen of Sweden, was educated and dressed like a boy from her birth because her father was disappointed at not having a son. She was more a king than a queen, and after four years of rule resigned her crown and went off to amuse herself in Europe. She was dressed in men's clothes and acted as unapologetically as any man who ever owned his clothes by right of sex. She was only twenty-eight at the time.
